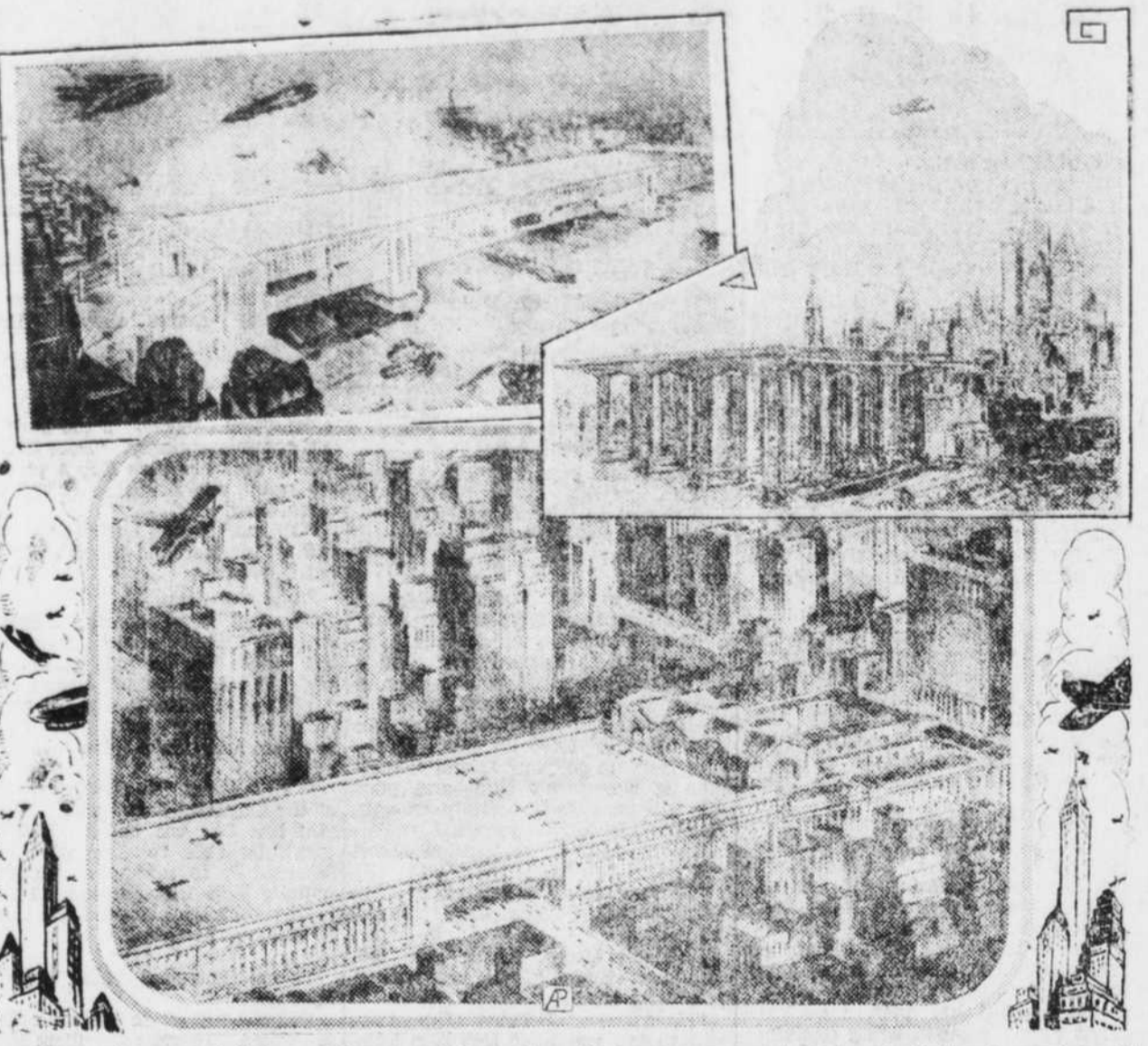
The University of Nevada's team in dairy livestock and dairy products judging took fifth honors in competition with similar teams from colleges of agriculture in six other states.

# HEROIC ACTS RECOUNTED AS CARNEGIE AWARDS GIVEN

PITTSBURGH, Nov. 1. (UP) The Carnegie Hero Fund Commission today recognized 51 acts of heroism at its regular fall meeting here. Two silver and 49 bronze medals were awarded.

Nineteen heroes lost their lives in the performance of the acts which the Carnegie Fund recognized and to the dependents of eight of these pensions aggregating \$7,030 a year were granted. To the dependents of eight others who lost their lives the sum of \$4,300 was granted to be applied as the commission may see fit.

In addition to these money grants, \$14,400 were appropriated for educational purposes, payments to be made as needed and approved and in 20 cases awards aggregating \$17,500 were made for other worthy purposes. Payments in the one-sum beneficiaries' plans for the use of the awards have been approved by the commission.

Both silver medals were awarded to persons who helped to save others from drowning. One of these awards was to a woman and the other to a man who died in his efforts to save another's life.
