BAYLOR, PACED BY WILSON, TOPS FIELD IN SOUTHWEST



This is Jake Wilson, backfield specialist who has helped the Baylor Bears to a good start in the Southwest conference campaign.

WACO, Tex. (AP)—Every so often a small school's gridiron warriors make the rest of the football world sit up and take notice. Baylor University's Bears, crouching behind a wealth of promising material, hope to wedge into that spotlight this fall.

Winning their first four games, Baylor already is a dominating menace on the Southwest conference horizon. Larger schools in the circuit heard pre-season rumors of Baylor's strength; now they believe them.

Morley Jennings, head coach, has so much material that his biggest problem is to give every star a chance. There are a dozen backs, all of almost equal calibre, and a bevy of veteran linemen scrambling for regular berths.

Critics call Baylor's line prospects among the best in Southwest conference history. Weldon Lucas, Bear captain, is at right end, with Bothey Kock, an all-conference guard last year, and Charles Morris, a smashing tackle.

The backfield is built around Jake Wilson, regarded as the best all-around back in the southwest. Baylor won the Southwest conference title in 1915, 1922 and 1924. In none of those years did the Bears have the galaxy of stars in this year's line-up.
