An Ordinance empowering, authorizing and directing the ex-officio Assessor of the City of Las Vegas, County of Clark, State of Nevada, to levy a special assessment to defray the costs of making certain improvements in the City of Las Vegas, by constructing, erecting and installing an ornamental street lighting system complete, including conduits, cables, standards, lighting units and all appurtenances thereto on certain streets and portions of streets in said city...

The Board of Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas Do Ordain:

Section 1. For the purpose of defraying the costs of making certain improvements in the City of Las Vegas, by constructing, erecting and installing an ornamental street lighting system complete, including conduits, cables, standards, lighting units and all appurtenances thereto, according to the plans, diagrams and estimates of cost there of on file in the office of the City Clerk of said City...

Section 2. The ex-officio City Assessor shall assess the taxable lots, property and premises situate in the special assessment district created by the terms of said Ordinance No. 142, benefitting by said improvements proportionately to the benefits received therefrom...

Section 3. In levying the assessments as in this Ordinance provided, the ex-officio Assessor shall prepare a Special Assessment Roll therefor, and after he shall have completed the Assessment as herein provided and completed the said Special Assessment Roll, he shall report the same to the Board of City Commissioners as provided for by law and upon receiving such report and Special Assessment Roll, the said Roll shall be numbered and filed in the office of the City Clerk...

Section 4. At the time appointed for the purpose of reviewing said assessments and considering any objections thereto made at said time or filed in writing, the Board of City Commissioners and the ex-officio Assessor shall meet and examine said assessments and will hear any objections to said assessments, which have been made or filed as aforesaid by any person deeming himself aggrieved thereby, and will decide upon the same as to any assessment, appearing necessary therefor, and will confirm it as reported or as corrected, or will refer the assessment back to the ex-officio Assessor for revision or annulment...

Section 5. Upon the confirmation and recording of the said Assessments and Assessment Roll as by the Charter of the City of Las Vegas provided, the Assessments shall be at once due and payable, and from the date of said confirmation and recording, shall constitute and be a lien upon the lot or parcel of land and premises assessed, together with the legal interest thereon, and shall be charged against the persons and properties until paid.

Would Honor First Smoker

SPANIARD OF COLUMBUS' DAY BROUGHT BACK TOBACCO. AYAMONTE, Province of Huelva, Spain, Nov. 11 (U.P.)—A movement is on foot to perpetuate the memory of Rodrigo de Jerez, a citizen of Ayamonte, whose claim to distinction lies in the fact that he was the first person in Europe to smoke.

Rodrigo de Jerez was one of the three Ayamonte citizens to accompany Christopher Columbus on his voyage of discovery. Tradition has it that Columbus personally recruited these men, and that Columbus himself lived in Ayamonte for a short while. When Rodrigo returned from America he retained his family and ceased his wanderings, but he had brought back with him a habit which was to get him into trouble—that of smoking. He brought also an ample supply of tobacco leaves. When Rodrigo's wife saw him smoking for the first time, she thought him possessed of devil and as a true faithfulness woman that she was, immediately informed the Inquisition of what had transpired. None other than the famous Father Tomas de Torquemada heard the case, and consigned Rodrigo to prison and ordered the house purified and drenched by the time that he had done his sentence there were several hundred tobacco smokers in Europe.

Ayamonte has already honored Rodrigo by naming a street after him, the very street on which he lived. His house still stands, and now the town council (Ayuntamiento) wants the Spanish Tobacco Monopoly—which derives great wealth due to the popularity of the habit brought to Europe by Rodrigo—to pay the expenses of having the house suitably designated by placing a marble marker pointing out its historical significance.
