Oddie's Message Arentz' Letter

Senator Tasker L. Oddie's view of the Nevada stand on the allocation question is set forth in a letter he addressed to Secretary Wilbur as follows:

Hon. Ray Lyman Wilbur, Secretary of the Interior, Washington, D. C.
My Dear Mr. Secretary:
The allocations of power by you on October 21, 1929, and the general procedure for the disposition of power under the Boulder Canyon Dam act are so obviously designed in the interests of California and at the expense of the interests and sovereign rights of the State of Nevada, that I desire, on behalf of that state, to enter a protest.
