Las Vegas Lads Rally, After White Pine Football Machine Takes Early Lead, and Make Three Touchdowns to Win Supremacy of High School Teams of Lower Half of State

Champions of Southern Nevada! This are Las Vegas high school's football eleven hailed. For they "came back" and fought their way to victory yesterday afternoon in the second half of the most exciting game of the present season, after Ely had secured the first touchdown of the game.

Coming out of a cloud of gloom which enveloped the field from the very first kickoff, when Ely secured the ball and made a trick side pass and a touchdown in the first half minute of the contest, the Vegas boys entered the second half with the score 6 to 0 against them.

Every inch of the field was a fight with a worthy foe. Foot by foot Vegas forced the ball ahead. Time and again they held the starward Ely line. And when the end came the score stood 19 to 6 in favor of the Las Vegas champions.

A great crowd of Vegas enthusiasts backed the local team and there was a considerable delegation from Ely present to cheer and root for the White Pine boys, giving zest to the occasion.

Ely stock rose to a new high for the year when, during the first half, the Vegas boys were unable to score. But as the second half advanced there was a slump in the Ely market and a corresponding increase in the enthusiasm which followed every move of the Vegas boys.
