Turn the Tables
The game yesterday turned the tables on the White Pine boys, who came out of the other Ely-Vegas game at Ely victorious through a last-minute play.

The Las Vegas proved themselves clearly the superior of the Ely team in yesterday's game.

The contest started with a sensational play on the part of the White Pine squad. Vegas kicked off to Ely, who had Donald Bates, right end, stationed near the sidelines. A twenty-five yard pass to Bates, followed by a twenty-five yard end run brought Ely, during the first half minute of the game, her first and only touchdown.

Wildcats Hold 'Em
Evidently confident of their power, possibly overly so, Ely then tried to put over a line buck, but failed to convert thereby.

Facing a 6 to 0 disadvantage at the very outset of the game, the local boys gritted their teeth and held Ely, who failed to make yardage and was compelled to punt on fourth down.

Vegas then tried three thrusts and had to punt, and Ely took the ball for two tabs and then punted.

During the first quarter Hauger had to be replaced by Andy Croal in the quarter berth because of ag-

gravation of an old injury from which Hauger's knee was suffering. The two teams had it nip and tuck for the remainder of the quarter and in half of the second quarter.

Pem Goes 'In
Pembroke was substituted for Parvin at right half because of injury suffered by the fighting full-back.

Vegas then demonstrated her superior power by making three successive first downs, thus starting her march toward victory. The half closed with Vegas having the edge, but unable to score a touchdown.

At the half Vegas kicked off to Ely, who had to punt, failing again to make first down.

Vegas then continued her onward march, pushing the ball to Ely's eight yard line. Vegas was then penalized for off side.

A punt made by Ely was blocked by Captain Abe Miller and Joe Rios recovered the ball to place it on Ely's one yard line.

Jarrett Scores
Jarrett, right half, then punted through two line bucks for the

Wildcats' first touchdown of the game. Beatty failed to convert.

Early in the fourth quarter Leland Beatty made a long run on fourth down, placing the ball in the shadow of the White Pine goal posts.

On second down Glen Jarrett brought the Vegas fans to their feet by dodging through to make the second touchdown for the Wildcats, putting them into the lead, 12 to 6.

Penalized for an off-side during the Vegas attempt to convert, Ely lost another point, bringing the score to 13-6.

Vegas was then going strong, and the Ely squad seemed to fly to pieces. The Wildcats made some fast triple passes and kept the Elyites guessing.

Beatty Scores
After snagging a pass from Jarrett, Beatty worked through Ely's line and footed two of the White Pine men for the Wildcats' third

touchdown.

Vic Taufer, for four years member of the University of Utah squad, refereed the game.
