# Minn. Revokes Sale License

Rights as Brokers Also Are Terminated in Case of Minneapolis Concern Placed in Receivership.

ST. PAUL, Nov. 30. (Special) --Four licenses of the W. B. Foshay Co., of Minneapolis, and subsidiaries, were revoked November 19 by the Minnesota commerce commission on the recommendation of the State securities commissioner, C. W.

Two of the licenses granted per mission to sell stock. The W. B. Foshay Company (Delaware corporation) revocation involved registration on June 7, 1928, of 6.599 shares of no par value common stock and 21,359 shares of no par value, series 1928, preferred capital stock; and on April 23, 1929, of 6,000 shares of series 1929 preferred stock, of no par value, selling price to be \$115.

The other stock sale license re voked was that of the Investors National Corporation (Delaware) a subsidiary. This company obtained registration May 16, 1928, of 10,-000 shares of no par value common, to sell at \$25, and on July 16, 1929, of 5,000 shares of the same stock,

The other two revocations were of broker licenses, granted to the W. B. Foshay company and the Foshay Trust & Savings Bank, both of Minneapolis.

After the naming of a receiver for the Foshay company, the securities division suspended the Foshav companies and issued orders for them to show cause why their licenses should not be revoked. There was no opposition to the revocation
