

### Russia Isn't Russia Any More, So Watch How You Address Xmas Mail

WASHINGTON, Dec. 11. (U.P.)—Russia has ceased to be Russia. Soviet postal authorities—and for that matter everyone else who hasn't been deported—no longer recognize the word as the official nomenclature of their country.

Christmas mail for a friend in the land of the Cossacks may cross and re-cross the Atlantic two or three times before finally arriving at its destination, according to an announcement of the National Geographic society here.

Mail may be properly addressed, even as to name, street, town and province, but may be refused on reaching the border simply because it bears the aristocratic and royal word "Russia." When this happens the mail must, retrace its long journey through Poland and Germany to Hamburg, where it is dispatched by steamer to the United States.

On reaching this country, the mail is returned to the sender providing

a return address is found, either inside or out. If not, it is resealed or rewrapped, the word "Russia" crossed out and the letters "U. S. S. R." affixed. Then another trip across the ocean is begun.

The U. S. S. R.—Union of Socialist Soviet Republics—is very particular about its name and long has threatened to refuse mail addressed to its imperial predecessor, Russia.

Other European nations are equally as punctilious about names, notably Finland, Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania, Czechoslovakia, Jugoslavia, Roumania, Albania and Turkey, which has just adopted an entirely new alphabet.

After spending three years compiling a new map of war-torn Europe, the National Geographic society discovered many names had been changed, forcing a recheck of the whole work. The society advises everyone to consult the post office before addressing mail to Europe.

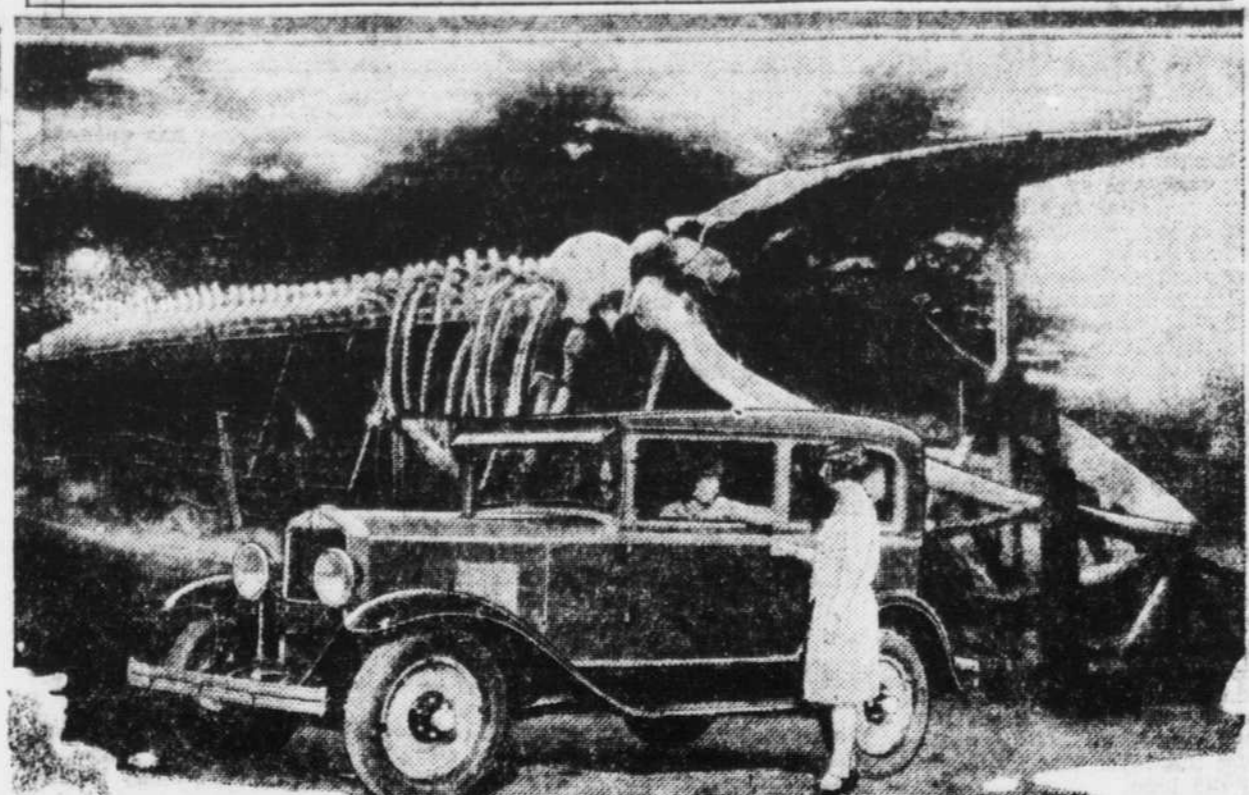

### Women's Gains Are Shown By Income Taxes

Fair Sex Important Source of Revenue for Government, Analysis of 1929 Figures Shows.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 11. (U.P.)—Rapid economic strides made by women in recent years are reflected in income tax returns which reveal members of the fair sex as an important source of revenue for the federal government.

An analysis of 1929 income tax returns made by treasury experts discloses that single women made 533,199 returns in that year and had a net taxable income aggregating \$2,233,844,068. In addition, wives filed 1,271,9 separate returns and reported net income of \$1,219,714,318.

For the same year single men filed 1,512,497 tax returns and reported aggregate net taxable income of \$4,912,025,508. Husbands and wives filing joint returns totaled 2,016,850 and had net taxable income of \$13,870,232,343.

Study of the above figures shows that a greater part of the federal revenue from individual income taxes is derived from married persons, while returns by single women constituted one-third the number filed by single men. Single women also had net income aggregating about one-third those reported by single men.

Chairman Kimball was in charge of yesterday's program. He introduced Albert V. Weigel, domestic trade commissioner of the Los Angeles Chamber of Commerce.

Mr. Weigel gave a very interesting discourse on the importance of a better understanding being built up between Los Angeles and Las Vegas. The subject was timely as far as the Kiwanians are concerned, as they have adopted for their major objective for 1930, "A Better Understanding of Civic Affairs."
