TRI-STATE CONFERENCE CERTAINTY

Governor of Arizona Wires Wilbur That River Commission Approves Confab

PHOENIX, Ariz., Dec. 30 (U.P.)—The last obstacle to the tri-state Colorado river conference here in January to attempt ironing out of difficulties which have arisen between Arizona, California and Nevada was removed today.
