The developments under the hood where engine outputs have been raised will be refinements of transmissions facilitating gear shifting, quieting operation, and putting cars within "finger-tip control."

Steel bodies will be used more generally while new alloys have been employed to increase life and efficiency of valves as well as insure pistons withstanding high temperatures and retaining their shape.
