- Beef a la Mode Mashed Turnips Spiced Peaches Bread Butter Fruit Gelatin Salad Ice Box Cookies Coffee

Beef a la Mode, Serving 6 1 pound round steak, ground 4 tablespoons chopped onions 3 tablespoons chopped onions 1/2 cup diced celery 1 teaspoon salt 1/2 teaspoon paprika 1 cup kidney beans, cooked 2 cups tomatoes 2 cups cooked macaroni Heat meat in a frying pan. When hot add and brown meat, onions and celery. Add rest of ingredients. Cook slowly 20 minutes. Stir frequently.

Fruit Gelatin Salad 1 package lemon flavored gelatin mixture 1 1/2 cups boiling water 1-3 cup boiling pineapple juice 1-3 cup salad dressing 2-3 cup diced pineapple 1/2 cup grape fruit, diced 1/2 cup peaches. Pour the water over gelatin mixture and stir until dissolved. Add the pineapple juice. Chill and allow to thicken a little. Fold in rest of ingredients and pour into mold. Set in a cold place to stiffen. Unmold on lettuce. Surround with more salad dressing and serve, cut in slices.

Ice Box Cookies 1 cup butter 2 cups dark brown sugar 2 eggs 1 teaspoon vanilla 1 cup chopped nuts 1 teaspoon cream of tartar 1 teaspoon soda 1/2 teaspoon salt 3/4 cup flour 3/4 cup shortening Cream the butter until soft. Add the sugar and eggs. Beat 2 minutes.

Her little brother, Herbert 3rd, more shy, does not like to pose without his mother. He is greatly interested in the "White House dogs." He centers his attention on Shamrock, almost as tall as the boy himself.

Sometimes Mrs. Hoover takes Peggy Ann and Herbert 3rd to visit their grandfather in his office. From their third floor nursery they descend in an elevator to the first floor of the White House. Walking very sedately, little Herbert clinging to his grandmother's hand, they pass through the rose garden and down a corridor.

The President's door, for whose opening important persons often

wait patiently, swings almost magically ajar for them.

When a recent snowstorm visited the capital Mrs. Hoover took the children to Rock Creek park to enjoy the novelty of making snowballs and sliding down hill.

Transferred from the quiet of a small California garden to probably the most famous residence in the United States they face the camera men with composure. Peggy Ann has even been featured in the "talkies." The curly-haired little four-year-old miss is not afraid to pose alone. She makes a good subject, cameramen say.

Her little brother, Herbert 3rd, more shy, does not like to pose without his mother. He is greatly interested in the "White House dogs." He centers his attention on Shamrock, almost as tall as the boy himself.

Sometimes Mrs. Hoover takes Peggy Ann and Herbert 3rd to visit their grandfather in his office. From their third floor nursery they descend in an elevator to the first floor of the White House. Walking very sedately, little Herbert clinging to his grandmother's hand, they pass through the rose garden and down a corridor.

The President's door, for whose opening important persons often

wait patiently, swings almost magically ajar for them.

When a recent snowstorm visited the capital Mrs. Hoover took the children to Rock Creek park to enjoy the novelty of making snowballs and sliding down hill.

The White House yard affords them ample playground and in bad weather they have a large glass enclosed porch and also a play room in which to amuse themselves.
