OIL PROCESS IS SOLD FOR \$22,000,000

Widow of Meat Packer Receiver \$8,000,000 as Her Share

CHICAGO, Jan. 7 (UP)—The widow of the late J. Ogden Armour, multi-millionaire packer, who has been living in a modest apartment since their \$159,000,000 fortune was trimmed to insolvency by post-war cancellation of meat contracts in foreign nations, realized more than \$8,000,000 today from the sale of the Dub's oil cracking process by the Universal Oil Products company to Shell, Union and Standard Oil of California for \$22,000,000.

France Moves To Save Her Old Churches

PARIS, Jan. 7 (UP)—Through the generosity of John D. Rockefeller, the mutilated glory of Rheims Cathedral is being restored and this has caused a group of French citizens to start a movement to preserve the village churches of Normandy, Brittany, Vendee and other French provinces, from ruin.

A national campaign to raise 10,000,000 francs for this purpose will start this year. A national league for the preservation of French churches is being formed, principally to prevent the dismantling of pretty little Gothic structures and their shipping stone by stone, to be re-erected in America.

World-famous cathedrals, such as those at Chartres and Rouen, have to be classed as "historical monuments" which preserves them from being sold abroad and permits them to be kept in repair with government subsidies.

But there are thousands of other churches which are worthy of interest and there is no practical method for preventing them from going to decay.

The cost of the project is estimated at ten million francs, about \$400,000, to be raised chiefly by private subscription. This will be sufficient to save the old churches from falling down. Restoration in any sense beyond that arresting further decay is not contemplated.
