Stock Market Slump Totals Forty Billion

(Continued from Page One) The \$40,648,398.395 stock market loss would buy 739 of these buildings and leave \$3,398,395 for incidental expenses.

There is under construction a new suspension bridge over the Hudson river connecting New York with New Jersey. It is the only bridge in New York City on that river. It is to cost \$60,000,000 when completed.

23 Biggest Corporations which could be purchased for the \$31,805,000,000 are American Telephone & Telegraph, U. S. Steel, Pennsylvania Railroad, Southern Pacific, Standard of New Jersey, New York Central, Canadian Pacific, General Motors, Aetna, Union Pacific, Sinclair Oil, Cities Service, Commonwealth & Southern, Bethlehem Steel, Electric Bond & Share, General Petroleum, North American Company, United Gas Improvement, Ford Motor Company, Niagara & Hudson, and Consolidated Gas.

At the close of 1930 each stock on the big board was selling at an average of \$37.90 per share. This represented a reduction of \$36.80 per share, or nearly 50 percent from the highs recorded on September 1, 1929.

The heaviest losses were suffered by the railroad shares, that group decline more than five billions in market value. Chemical shares lost 4 1/2 billions, oils 4 billions, electrical equipments 3 1/2 billions, gas and electric and communication issues (utilities) nearly 4 and steels nearly 2 billions.

There are now 1,308 stock issues listed on the "big board," with total shares aggregating 1,296,794,480.

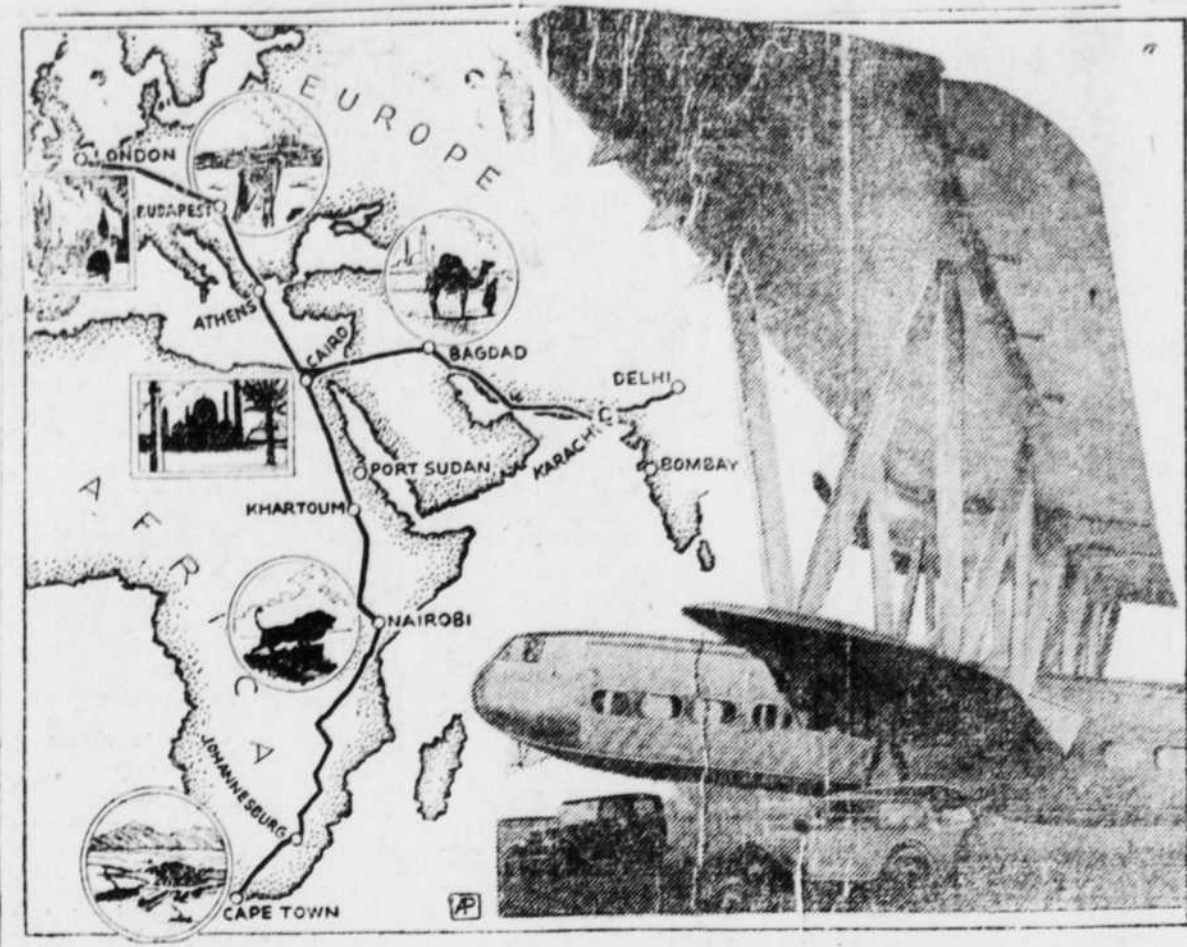

GIANT PLANES SOON TO INAUGURATE ENGLAND'S NEW 8,000-MILE AIRWAY



The world's longest airway, 8,000 miles, from London to Cape Town, will soon be in operation. View of plane (right) gives an idea of the giant 35-passenger liner, eight of which will fly as far as Cairo on the route.

LONDON, Jan. 14. (AP)—The first leg of the world's longest airway—the 8,000-mile London to Cape Town route—is to be operating early this year.

The whole line will be ready for day flying in mid-summer, the Imperial Airways announces. The route crosses the continent by way of Budapest, jumping across the Mediterranean at Athens to Cairo, which is the junction for the India line.

From Cairo it heads south, up the Nile and then more or less down the African east coast, although well inland, to the continent's tip.

The journey from London to Cape Town will take 11 days by air, as against 17 by the swiftest surface transportation. The 5,700 miles over Africa will take 9 days, for there is no night flying yet contemplated, although plans for lighting at least part of the route are being considered.

To organize the route cost \$5,000,000, according to officials of the company. Landing fields had to be established along the African route and hotels provided at stopping points.

Twenty-seven main landing fields have been established and 30 emergency fields, some of them in the heart of virgin bush. The ground organization also includes hangars, workshops, wireless and weather reporting stations and quarters for the airway staff. At no time, the airline officials say, will the ships be out of touch with the ground stations.

From London to Cairo passengers will travel new giant Handley-Page airliners, claimed the largest land craft in the world in service. The company is building eight of these machines to cost \$1,000,000.

ALASKAN PILOTS RETURN

ANCHORAGE, Alaska, Jan. 14.—UP—Pears which had been felt for the safety of Pilot Frank Der-

band and Altona Cape, missing since Saturday and Sunday, were stilled when the two pilots returned here late today unharmed.

Cope took off last Saturday on a short commercial flight to the Cook Inlet, region. When he failed to return by the next day, Derband left to search for him.

No word was heard from either of the pilots for three days, until they returned here this afternoon and many persons had feared another Alaska air tragedy.

SPIES! A Million Eyes Watch All of Europe as Volunteer Spies Send Information Back to Russia

Germany's War Espionage System Model Of Efficiency and the Envy Of the Allies

(Continued from Tuesday) By RALPH HEINZEN United Press Staff Correspondent (Copyright, 1931, United Press) PARIS, Jan. 14. (AP)—Intelligence men throughout Europe credit Russia with the most efficient espionage service, and refer with admiration to the "Eye of Moscow."

These "eyes" are communists. They live for a cause. Few of them are the sort of "professionals" envisaged by European governments. Most of them are private citizens, who see in communism the salvation of the workers of the world. They report to their local organization, and these in turn report to central offices.

Million Eyes It has been said that "Moscow watches the world go round through a million eyes" and police in Eastern Europe are inclined to believe that it is no much of an over-estimate. Recent hauls by Rumanian and Bulgarian police have netted communist spies, while Latvia and Finland during the past summer showed as many more over the frontier.

Every communist, regardless of nationality, is an enthusiastic "eye of Moscow." The archives of communist organizations are crisscrossed with information of every one which these voluntary spies furnish and which will take years to classify. This spying is in every field, commercial, industrial, military, diplomatic, religious and personal.

The spies in the active employ of the Rumanian government are a very small proportion. Russia needs fewer "professionals" than most other powers. There are Polish, French, German, British, Balkan and Italian spies.

Spy Prosperity The Balkans are overrun with spies. There are so many that they bring a certain prosperity to the country. Some spend their days and nights spying, others spy on the spies. All are free-spenders and they work in bands which are difficult to hide from the eyes of the police.

In all the countries of Europe, communists have filtered into national administrations, post offices, armies, navies, mines and factories. Communists have their fingers on the pulse of Europe.

Not long ago, Maurice Leparote, founder of the famed communist youth organization around Europe, broke with Moscow and published a book in which he "exposed" the an-

der side of the spy system. In his book, he declared that a few hours after the French, British, German or other army is furnished with a new rifle, a new style of marching shoe, a novel cannon or a new type of airplane, a report is on its way through channels back to a foreign capital.

In factories spies watch chemists and engineers and give detailed reports of new secret processes of manufacture, formulae for steel alloys, production costs and market conditions.

Bag of Documents Not long ago French police detained a bag filled with documents destined for Moscow from agents in western Europe. The bag was simply marked: "For Harry," a number, the date, and a red seal with the hammer and sickle.
