Helping the Homemaker

By LOUISE BENNETT WEAVER SWISS STEAK FOR COLD DAY

- Breakfast: Stewed Prunes, chilled; Cooked Wheat, Cereal and Cream; Bran Graham Gems; Coffee; Luncheon: Cream of Potato Soup; Crackers; Dill Pickles; Head Lettuce; Russian Dressing; Chocolate Cookies; Dinner: Swiss Steak; Mashed Potatoes; Buttered Beans; Bread; Fruit Salad; Cheese and Wafers; Coffee.

- Bran Graham Gems: 1 cup bran, 1 cup Graham flour, 1 cup flour, 5 tablespoons sugar, 3 tablespoons molasses, 1 teaspoon soda, 1 teaspoon baking powder, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 2 eggs, 1-3 cups buttermilk or sour milk, 2 tablespoons butter, melted. Mix all ingredients and beat 20 minutes. Half fill greased muffin pans. Bake 15 minutes in moderate oven. Serve warm with butter.

- Cream of Potato Soup: 2 cups diced potatoes (raw), 2 tablespoons chopped onions, 2 tablespoons chopped parsley, 2 tablespoons chopped celery leaves, 1 teaspoon salt, 1/4 teaspoon paprika, 4 cups cold water, 3 tablespoons butter, 3 tablespoons flour, 3 cups milk. Mix potatoes, seasonings and water. Cover and cook slowly 35 minutes. Mash well. Melt butter and add flour. When blended, add milk. Cook until mixture thickens a little. Add potato mixture and cook one minute. Serve hot.

- Swiss Steak: 1 1/2 pounds round steak (cut 2-3 inch), 1/2 cup flour, 1 teaspoon salt, 1 teaspoon paprika, 3 tablespoons suet, chopped, 3 tablespoons onions, 3 tablespoons chopped parsley, 3 tablespoons chopped celery, 1 1/2 cups water. Mix flour into both sides of meat. Sprinkle with salt and paprika. Heat suet in frying pan. When hot add and brown onions and celery. Add meat and brown on both sides. Add half the water. Cover and cook 45 minutes, over very low fire. Add rest of the water and parsley. Cook another 45 minutes. This meat should cook very slowly.

GUIDING YOUR CHILD

By MRS. AGNES LYNE SUGGESTION

It has perhaps not occurred to you that your efforts to stop your child from doing something he should not do may really be fixing the undesirable behavior more firmly than ever. He sucks his thumb and you repeat a hundred times a day: "Don't suck your thumb." Every time you say it you are reminding him of the very thing you wish him to stop. It is hardly the child's fault if you influence him to do the very opposite of what you wish.

Or you are taking him with you on a shopping trip and you say: "Last time I took you with me you teased and teased me to buy you things. You cried because I wouldn't buy you a train. You wanted a balloon, and you weren't happy until I let you have an ice cream soda that made you sick. This time I want you to promise not to ask for a single thing." Your speech has done nothing but remind him of all the things he wanted and has probably made him want them all over again. He will probably behave even worse this time than last.

A moment's thought would make plain how these attitudes of yours influence the child in the opposite way from that which you wish. But you are busy, and "don't" is the easiest formula. It is much easier

CORTLAND, N. Y., Jan. 23. (AP)—Miss Lillian Breeds, teacher of district school No. 9 in Tompkins county, can be given full credit for being in love with her work. Five days a week, rain, snow or shine, Miss Breeds travels 6 1/2 miles from her farm home to the school she teaches, and sits down at her desk before one lone pupil. Then at the end of the teaching day she travels 6 1/2 miles home again. The lone pupil is Robert Jacobs, a fifth grader from Groton, who insisted on going to Miss Breeds' school because he said he did not like the one at home. At the first of the present school year Robert had two schoolmates, Charles and George Crawford, seven and six years old, respectively. Charles, however, became ill in November and had to leave school. George immediately lost interest in education, and was taken out.
