German Socialist Vs. Communist Fray Wounds Over 150

BERLIN, Jan. 26 (AP)—Sporadic fighting between National Socialists and Communists in various German towns Sunday resulted in a total of wounded conservatively estimated at 150.

Forty Communists and eight Nazis were injured in fighting at Grebenstein, near Kassel. Similar disturbances were reported from Berlin, Eberswald, Dresden, Eismark and Wriezen.

Five Fire Companies Called To Fight Blaze

LOS ANGELES, Jan. 26 (AP)—Five fire companies were called out late today to fight a blaze of undetermined origin which threatened to destroy the Los Angeles Sack company. Firemen said the damage would reach \$190,000.

Dense clouds of smoke from piles of smouldering flasks hampered efforts of firemen to control the blaze.

Bill Would Limit Crude Oil Imports To 15,000,000 Barrels

WASHINGTON, Jan. 26 (AP)—A bill to limit importations of crude petroleum within the next three and to prohibit entirely during that period importations of refined petroleum products, except small amounts for scientific purposes, was introduced in the house today by Representative Garber, Republican, Oklahoma.

The measure carries a maximum penalty of \$5,000 and two years imprisonment for violation.

By HOWARD W. BLAKESLEE (Associated Press Staff Editor) CAMDEN, N. J., Jan. 26 (AP)—A ship that is perhaps the strangest-looking, most daring ever built by man is to be launched here on Washington's birthday.

She is the U. S. navy submarine O-12, rebuilt to sail under the ice of the North pole next summer carrying an 18-man scientific expedition led by Sir Hubert Wilkins.

She looks like a steel fish humped, round, belled. Her snub nose is armed with a long horn. She has two queer fins over her back and one under her spine-like tail.

The back fins are a trolley for running under the ice and a jack-knife periscope which folds back when she strikes floes. The tail fin is a framework guarding the propeller blades and rudder from ice.

Her back is a pair of steel runners, arching from nose to stern. Under their protection are housed her old conning tower, a new conning tower that can be thrust upward to bore through 13 feet of ice, a diver's chamber and a fixed deck light forward.

There also are two slender, vertical pipes aft, out of which two hollow, boring shafts can be extended upward through 100 feet of ice.
