"WIDE OPEN" GAMBLING BILL TO BE PRESENTED IN HOUSE NEXT WEEK

Would Provide Flat License of \$75.00 Per Month on Each Game—Will Create Revenue And Promote "Monte Carlo" Resorts

RENO, Jan. 30. (A)-With the legislature in recess, visiting assembly men and senators predicted here today that the projected "wide open" gambling bill will be introduced in the lower house sometime next week.

Considerable secrecy is attached to the terms of the measure, but it is said the law would provide for a flat license fee of \$75.00 per month for every gambling game operated in the gambling resorts.

The bill is being sponsored for the double purpose of securing a license revenue from the gambling games that are allegedly operated despite the persent law, which makes all but a few games illegal, and for the purpose of attracting tourists to proposed "Monte Carlo" resorts in the state
