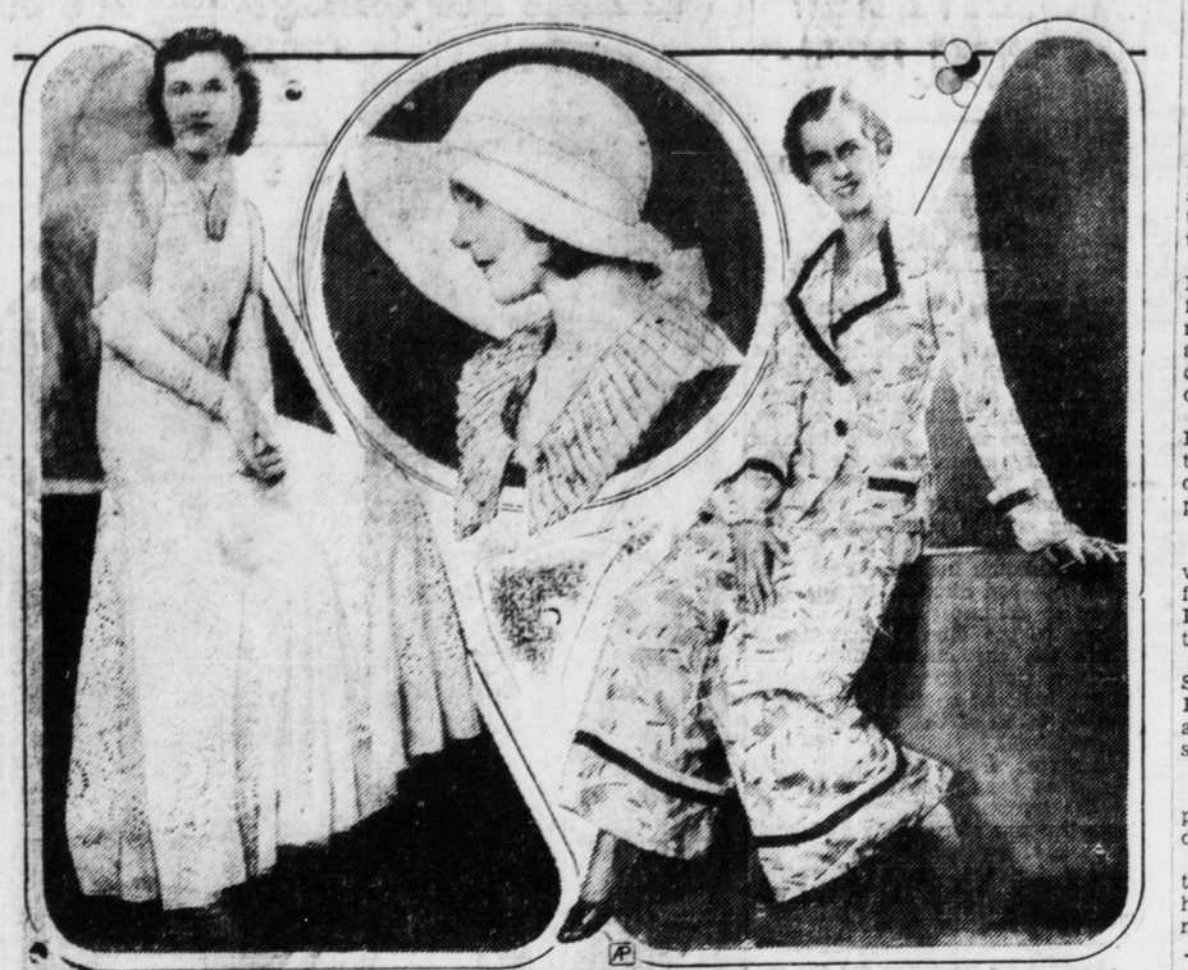

NEW YORK, Feb. 4. (AP)—New York has no outstanding Monsieur Worth or Madame Chanel to create style wants. But it has a commercial system and analytical organizations which anticipate women's ideas about clothes and make it possible to supply articles before the rank and file of women are conscious that they long for just those things. This spring, the survey shows, women are going to want lots of brown, much black and white, some blue and white, a variety of pastel colors and gay things for evening.

Sprung is on its way. New York already is making those things, so when the first fine days come they'll be on the racks of department stores and specialty shops everywhere. Wholesale manufacturers are making up coats, dresses and suits by the hundred thousands. Milliners and shoe manufacturers already know what American women will wear in May, June and July.

This season, for style's sake, hats and coats often go separate ways. Dresses and coats contrast instead of matching. Shoes, hats and gloves are in a combination with dresses. Day Coats Semi-Flared Daytime coats for spring are to be of plain, dark color, and dull spongy surfaced fabrics. Most of them will follow semi-flared lines, be belted and have interesting collar and sleeve details. Many detachable scarf ideas will be incorporated in coat and dress models.

Wood browns, green, blue, black and white dominate street costumes. Coats and dresses contrast more frequently than they match. Hats and shoes tend to be the color of the dress rather than match the coat. Many coats will be seven-eighths length, accenting the two-color costume idea.

Afternoon Coats Shorter Coats with afternoon costumes are definitely shorter for early spring. Later in the season nearly every little short-sleeved silk dress will have its own short jacket. Long sleeves, colored sandals and beautiful handbags have struck up one of the neatest style alliances. They not only share their color scheme but are made of the same suede or kid.

Simplicity is the keynote of day clothes—simplicity that is individual and personal. But elegance bordering on the romantic is essential to success in the evening. Stress Alluring Lines Soft feminine fabrics, unusual and stimulating colors, and alluring lines are elements in the elegance of evening dresses.

Some of the new colors are mint and lime greens, lemon yellow, turquoise, blue, peach and golden brown. Tulle and chiffon dresses combine several shades in panel and tier effects. Shoulders are smarter: when covered with cap sleeves, collars or cape scarves, except for formal wear. Sleeveless or scarfless dresses usually have accompanying short coats.
