CHARLESTON WATER RIGHTS COMPROMISED

A hearing before Deputy State Engineer Rappers at Carson City was held Tuesday to pass on applications for the waters of Little Falls for use on portions of the Charleston park area. Those in attendance were E. W. Griffith, Robert Griffith, R. D. Miller and C. P. Squires. A friendly compromise was entered into whereby the water was divided between the Griffith interests on the one side, and Dr. Roy W. Martin and C. P. Squires as trustees, on the other. By the terms of the compromise each side agrees to convey a one-fourth interest in their allocations to the United States for service for the purpose of creating and maintaining a public camping ground in the Charleston park area.
