Moscow Divorce Brings Dilemma: Where To Live?

MOSCOW, Feb. 20. (AP)—Where to live after divorce is one of the newly pressing questions of Moscow.

It is an off-shoot of the housing problem which has grown more acute as thousands of workers have been drawn to the cities by the government's big industrial projects.

Getting the divorce is easy. If there are no children either the husband or the wife signs a register, pays a small fee and the thing is done.

But with room at a premium, they must, at present, continue to live in the same quarters—or sleep in the streets.

By law each person is entitled to a living space of 35 square feet. A married couple, therefore, may have twice that area in which to move and have their being, but as things are, a husband and wife who have a room to themselves are considered lucky.

In many cases four and five persons are quartered in the one room. A woman who got a divorce after seven years of wedded life, related that she searched in vain for new living quarters. So she and her ex-

husband had continued to live in the single room, although they had not spoken to each other for seven months.

The only escape from the impasse would be for each to discover a new mate simultaneously. Then there could be a general exchange of quarters that would solve the problem.
