County & City Boards Try to Keep Within **Legal Limits** 

The county commissioners devoted their meeting of yesterday printo a discussion of the budget mass and means to keep the demands of the county

to the court ouse was plactically abandoned for the present, although some of the bond buyers who appeared to urge the sale of the bond issue authorized by the legislature contended that such bonds may be retired with a tax levy about the five cent rate fixed by law. Some of the bond buyers expressed the willingness to buy the bonds on such a basis, but the board members were reluctant to go to such lengths.

The city of Las Vegas was limited to a levy of 1.172, which is all that remains of the \$5.00 rate after providing for the county expenses and echools. With this limit it is considered by the board impossible to proceed with street improvements and extensions of the sewer system at the present time, unless the view of the bond buyers that bond issues authorized by the legislature are exempt from the five cent limita-
