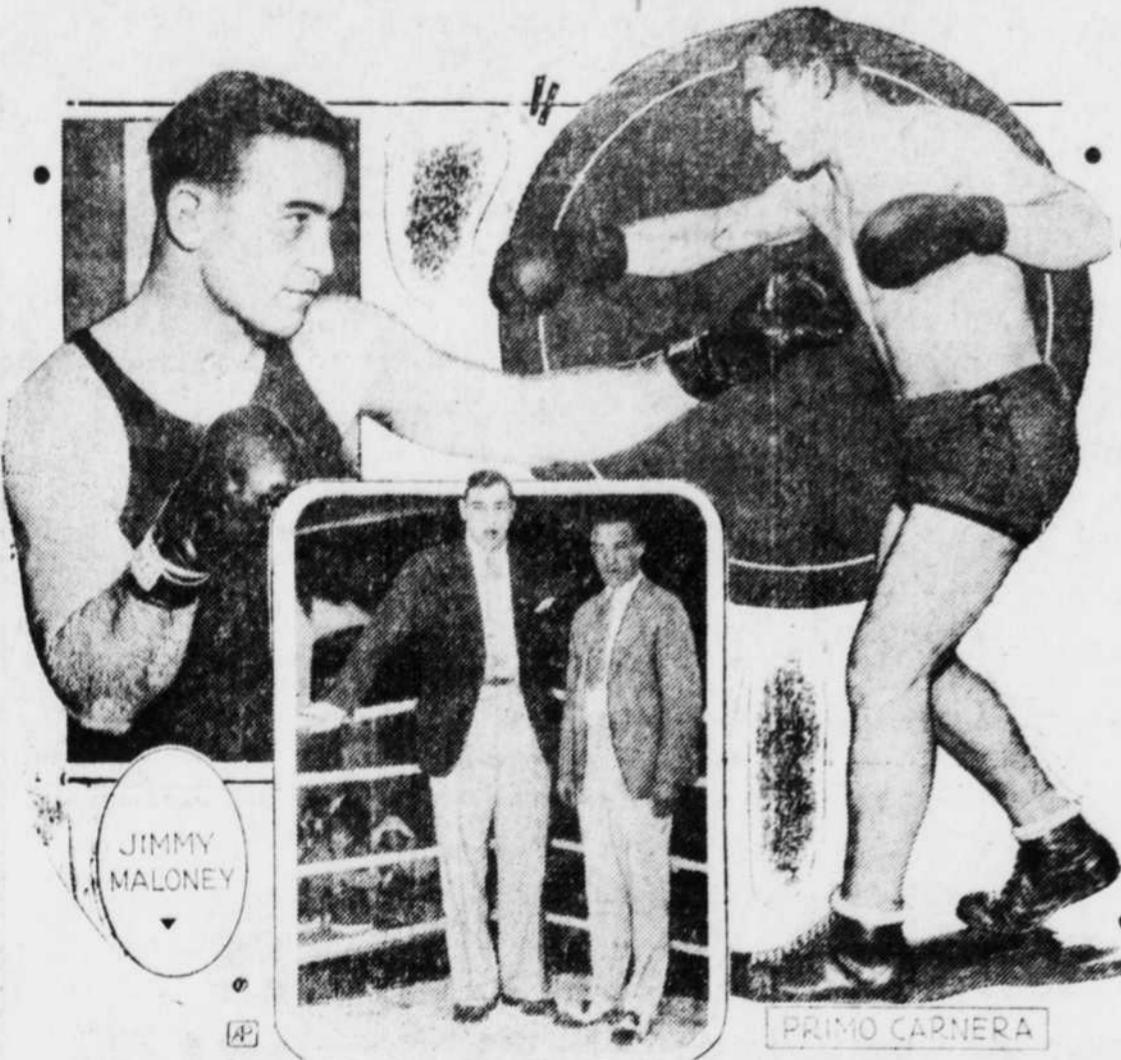


# MALONEY IN FINE SHAPE FOR MIAMI BOUT: CLAIM ITALIAN HAS BAD RIB

The reclamation bureau began its study of the river in 1919. It has designed a dam to be 727 feet high from the canyon floor; 650 feet thick at the bottom; 45 feet thick at the top, and 1,180 feet in length. Five million cubic yards of cement will be used in the construction.
