Barrett O'Hara, defense counsel, who led Kirkland through a long recital of his love affair with Arlene Draves, was forced to admonish the dapper, athletic every few minutes to "buck up."

Tears came into Kirkland's eyes every few questions. He figured on the stand under the gaze of his mother and the Draves family. He testified he fell in love with Arlene while he was driving an ice wagon in Gary, went to many social affairs with her and finally asked her to become his wife. They attempted to elope, he said, but Arlene became ill when they got to Valparaiso and the wedding was put off.
