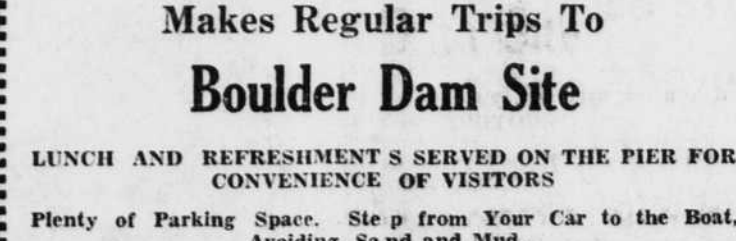
Bannon Rites to Be Held Today
