ON THE SIDELINES

Bill Tilden is not sorry he turned tennis pro and is very happy in his new status.

"I have nothing to worry about now," he said. "No more bickering with the United State Lawn Tennis association or anything like that. Not that I have anything against the amateur tennis officials, for I haven't, but our squabbles didn't do the game any good. We were both a bit wrong, I guess, but everything is all right now."

Tilden now is devoting his attention to a series of motion pictures, but in the back of his head he has an ambition to return to the stage. He does not put it into words, contenting himself with the observation:

"I don't know that I have given up the stage. I will always be open to offers, if any. I love to act—in fact, acting with me comes before tennis, and everybody knows how I love tennis."

Sees Open Tourneys Tilden thinks the U. S. L. T. A. soon will sanction open tournaments in which both professionals and amateurs may compete without danger to the simple pure standing of the amateurs.

"Tennis professionals, like golf professionals, help the game," he said.

With the exception of Bobby Jones there hasn't been an amateur golfer capable of competing consistently with the professionals that I can remember. And it's the influence of these professionals which has boosted golf and made it the game the young and old are now playing.

By the same line of reasoning within the next few years the effect of the tennis professionals will be felt the same way. Winnie Richards and the Kinsey boys were the only noted tennis professionals in this country. Now that Emmett Pare, Frank Hunter and Bobby Sailer have joined me in the professional game tennis will benefit.

I don't say this to be tooting my own horn, but in every town in which we have played I have demonstrated to high school pupils everything I know about tennis, starting in and showing how every stroke is made. It's free teaching, too, and yet I get great enjoyment out of it.

"Big Bill" said his match with Karel Kozeluh in Omaha was the greatest he had ever played.

Calls Wood Best He thinks young Sidney Wood is the best youngster in the game today. Wood, he says, has "that indefinable something every champion must possess—touch."

Four 'Daddies' of Derby Winners Get Offspring in Year's Entries



The racing days of Man o' War and Sir Gallahad III have long since passed, but the old turf warriors have sons entered in the next Kentucky Derby, American track's blue ribbon event. Each has had an offspring romp home first in the classic.

LOUISVILLE, March 16. (AP)—Four horses that sired previous Kentucky Derby winners have sons among the 130 eligibles for this year's derby, which will be run at Churchill Downs May 16.

They are: Man o' War, Sir Gallahad III, Black Toney and Broomstick. Man o' War was the sire of Clyde Van Dusen, the gelding that won the 1929 derby. Sir Gallahad III sired Gallant Fox, last year's winner and three-year-old champion. Black Toney produced Black Gold, winner of the 1924 derby.

The sons of Virgil won the races of 1876, 1881 and 1886, and Falsetto sired the winners of the 1894, 1901 and 1906 derbies. King Alfonso sired the 1880 and 1885 derby winners; Longfellow the 1883 and 1890 winners, and Broomstick the 1911 and 1915 victors.

McGea was the sire of Donerail and Exterminator, respective winners of the 1913 and 1916 derbies, while Zev and Flying Gold, winners of the 1923 and 1923 derbies, respectively, were sired by The Finn.
