ABOARD U. S. S. ARIZONA, AT SEA, March 20. (U.P.)—Even the President of the United States must regulate his habits to the routine aboard a battleship on a "shake-down" cruise, President Hoover found today.

Relaxing with pleasure on his vacation cruise to the Virgin Islands and Porto Rico, he got up before 7 a. m. and went on deck for exercise.
