Frost Can't Foil Blossom Festival; It'll Be Indoors

WASHINGTON, March 27. (AP)—To steal a march on the weather's caprice, pretty capital girls will hold their festival of Washington's famed cherry blossoms indoors this year.

Three hundred performers, including prominent debutantes, dancers, members of the diplomatic corps and well-known society women, will part in a great musical spectacle.

The production, under the auspices of the Girl Scouts, will be launched April 27 in Constitution hall, not far from the White House. It will continue throughout the week.

This assures the pink and white presence of the chief actors—the cherry blossoms themselves. It assures also protection of chiffons and complexion from possible bad weather. Heretofore the outdoor rites have sometimes been foiled by rain, wind or frost.

The blooming of the Japanese cherry trees which annually draws thousands to the capital is expected this year around April 1. It is hoped the single blossoms will be in full bloom by Easter. The pink and white aura about the tidal basin, starting with the single blossoms and ending with the double, lasts about a month.

The embassies and legations of the four countries represented in the major scenes of the story—Mexico, Canada, Japan and Czechoslovakia—are co-operating in providing talent and costumes. There will be a chorus of 150 mixed voices and 50 dancing girls.

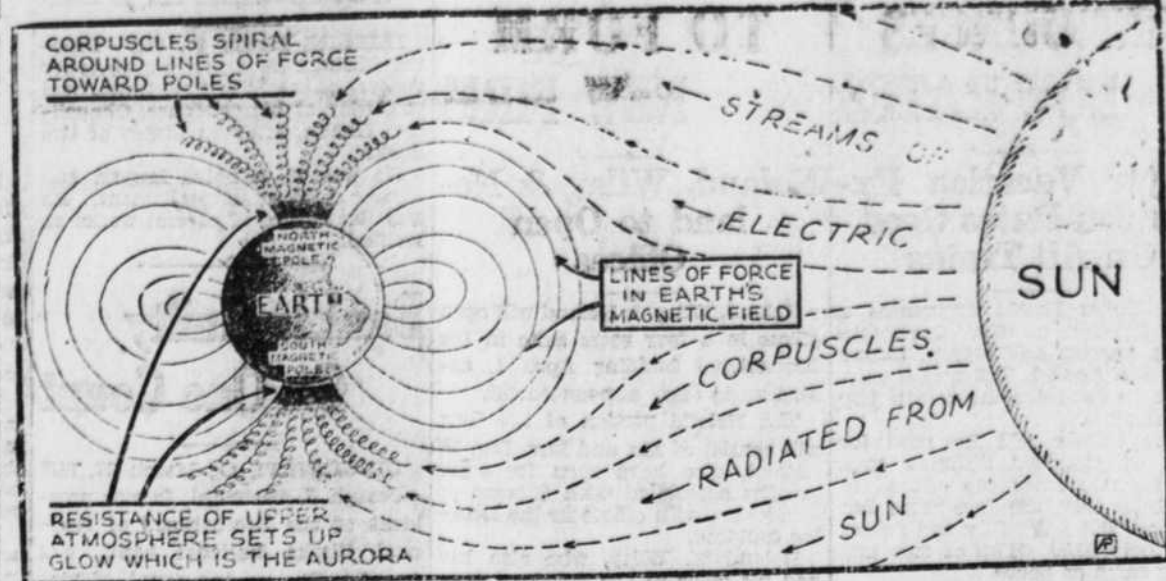

'Northern Lights' May Get 'Current' From Sun



This diagram illustrates how streams of electric corpuscles from the sun, according to the theory of Prof. Carl Stormer, Norwegian scientist, causes resistance in upper atmosphere, creating the 'northern lights'.

When deflected corpuscles reach the polar regions, they follow lines of magnetic force toward the earth, tracing a spiral path around the lines, like stripes around a barber pole.

To check his theory, Prof. Stormer calculated by mathematics the paths that corpuscles from the sun would follow as they neared the earth. Then he suggested that Dr. Ernst Bruch, a German scientist, photograph paths of electric corpuscles moving under conditions that were the same as though they were moving from the sun toward the earth. The results checked almost to perfection, indicating, Stormer believes, that his theory is correct.

The earth's upper atmosphere furnishes the resistance that heats the corpuscles, causing them to glow and give the light that is the aurora.

The earth is a huge magnet. Magnetic force emanates most strongly from the region of the north and south magnetic poles. In general this force follows a series of great loop-like paths around the earth from the vicinity of one polar region to the other. The area in space where the force travels is the earth's magnetic field.

Electric corpuscles from the sun are constantly bombarding the earth, says Prof. Stormer. Their exact nature is unknown, but they may be positively or negatively charged electrons.

The corpuscles are attracted toward the earth, but can reach it only near the magnetic poles, just as iron filings concentrate at the ends of a horseshoe magnet. Elsewhere the corpuscles are deflected by the earth's magnetic field as effectively as a steel plate deflects bullets.

Sun Not So Dazzling, After All; Here's Star 10,000 Times As Bright

MOUNT WILSON, Calif., March 27. (AP)—If the glare of the springtime sun on the pavement irritates the eyes, don't be downhearted. Things could be worse—the sun isn't so bright after all. Dr. Walter S. Adams, director of the Carnegie Institution of Washington observatory here, will tell you it has been measured and found to be 3,000,000,000,000,000,000,000,000,000 candlepower. That's a lot of candlepower, and the brightest electric arc looks like a black spot when seen against the sun's disk. But there are millions of stars much brighter. For instance, in the cool of the night one should look at Rigel in the constellation of Orion and contemplate how beautiful it seems. The sun goes into the shade in comparison with Rigel, for that brightest star in Orion is at least 10,000 times as bright as our sun. Fortunately for the people on the earth, Rigel is not where the sun is, a mere 93,000,000 miles from the earth, for there would be no living here then. Rigel is so far away that it takes its light more than 300 years to reach the earth, while the light of the sun makes the journey in about eight and a half minutes. And Canopus, famous star of Egypt, is still brighter.
