JAPANESE PREMIER SUFFERS

Assassins Bullets Send Statesman Again To Hospital

TOKIO, April 3. (U.P.)—Premier Hamaguchi of Japan will re-enter the Imperial hospital at 4 p. m. today for an operation, it was announced here this morning. The premier, who was critically wounded several months ago when an attempt was made to assassinate him in the railroad station here, has been suffering pains in the region where a bullet lodged. Early today physicians for the Imperial university were called to his residence while reports were circulated that the premier was much weaker than when he returned to his office recently. The statement said no acting premier would be appointed.

JOCELYN LEE VICTOR OVER LUTHER REED

Movie Girl Gets Divorce After Bitter Trial

LOS ANGELES, April 3. (U.P.)—After five days of sensational testimony, Jocelyn Lee, screen actress, was granted a divorce from Luther Reed, prominent film director, in superior court late today. Each had asked the decree.

She won custody of their minor children, Celeste, 3, and Dana, 2. The Reeds were married at Tijuana, Mexico, on June 15 of last year and separated in September in San Francisco. Miss Lee was awarded alimony of \$100 a week.

Both Miss Lee and Reed charged each other with blows during family quarrels in San Francisco, Agua Caliente and Hollywood.

Miss Lee testified that she and a private detective went to a house where Reed was living after the separation and that she broke in and found him with a woman, both unclothed.

PAIR GROOMS PLANE FOR TRIP 'ROUND WORLD IN EIGHT DAYS

OKLAHOMA CITY, Okla., March 30. (U.P.)—A stock young man opened the throttle of a powerful monoplane at Los Angeles last year and roared to Chicago to finish first in one of the national air races. A fortnight later a slim young Australian navigator hopped off from Japan with Harold Bromley in an attempt to span the Pacific. Motor trouble turned them back after they had flown 1,200 miles. Today a proposed assault on the 'round-the-world record of the Graf Zeppelin has brought together the race winner, Wiley Post, 32, and the navigator, Harold Gatty, 28. They will fly the same plane Post used in the race, christened the Winnie Mae in honor of the daughter of F. C. Hall, wealthy oil man, who is backing the attempt. Leaving Oklahoma City about May 23, they expect to be back again within eight days to claim a \$25,000 prize for breaking the Graf's time. The Graf Zeppelin made the trip in three weeks. There are three water hops, one of 1,900 miles across the Atlantic from Harbor Grace, N. F., on the 16,000-mile route they propose to

SOLDIERS' BONUS PAYMENTS HELP AUTOMOBILE INDUSTRY

Two Hundred Seventy-Eight Millions Paid Vets

WASHINGTON, April 3. (U.P.)—Purchase of automobiles by ex-soldiers with their bonus loans has contributed to a very noticeable pickup in the automotive industry recently which some experts interpret as the first sign of general business improvement. Reports here from various parts of the country indicate that many veterans have used their bonus loans to buy automobiles, either new or second hand.

A greater proportion of the money being paid to veterans, which Administrator Hines of the veterans' bureau would reach a billion dollars eventually, is going for the purchase of automobiles than for any other article on the market, it is believed. The government up to March 28 paid out \$278,081,530 to war veterans and applications still are coming in.

Jury Convicts Hymie Martin

CLEVELAND, April 3. (U.P.)—A verdict of guilty of first degree murder, with a recommendation of mercy, in the killing of former City Councilman William Potter was returned against "Pittsburgh" Hymie Martin by a jury of five women and seven men. Sentence was deferred for one week.

GUIDING YOUR CHILD

By MRS. AGNES LYNE LEARNING TO WASH

A child must learn to do a great number of things before he can get his hands and face clean enough to please his mother.

He must put the stopper in the hole of the basin, turn on the faucet just the right amount, to fill it with water neither too hot nor too cold. He must turn them off in town to prevent a flood, get his wash cloth from the hook, wet it and wring it out so that it will not drip all over his clothing before he applies it to his face.

He must manipulate it so as to rub it over the entire surface of his face. He must manage the slippery cake of soap, apply it thoroughly over his hands, front and back. He must rise the soap off, pull out the stopper, and wring his wash cloth dry. He must get his towel from the rack, dry himself

thoroughly and hang it up again. This is really a great deal to learn, and other should therefore welcome every little effort which the child makes to do some part of the washing ritual for himself. The two-year-old usually enjoys turning the faucet off and on and putting the stopper into the hole. A box to stand on makes it easier for him to reach these things. He enjoys bringing washcloth and towel to mother if these are hung where they are easily accessible.

The child enjoys learning to wash himself if his mother makes it a point to welcome his efforts. Rushing him through the process, permitting him to do nothing for himself, is the surest way to establish a resistance to the whole business, making him unable or unwilling to wash himself, when he is otherwise quite self-reliant.
