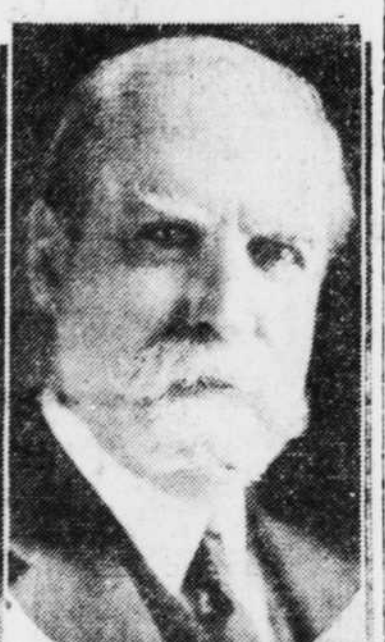

OFFICIALS INDICTED ON CONSPIRACY CHARGES IN GALLUP, NEW MEXICO

Collecting Fines as Protection Fees Charged Against Men Prominent in New Mexico Politics

SANTA FE, N. M., April 10. (U.P.)—A federal grand jury indicted three officials, a prominent attorney and two gamblers, charging bootleggers' conspiracy counts, charging bootleggers and gamblers and protected in Gallup for the purpose of collecting fines as fees for the city treasury.
