MEAD SIGNS CONTRACT ON HOOVER DAM

Forty-Eight Million Obligation Completed Yesterday

Dr. Elwood Mead, commissioner for the United States Bureau of Reclamation, at 11:50 a. m. yesterday in the office of Construction Engineer Walker R. Young, affixed his signature to the \$48,800,985.50 contract with Six Companies, Inc., for the construction of Hoover Dam and the power houses.

FIVE DIE IN TUNNEL FIRE; MANY INJURED

30 Firemen Overcome By Underground Blaze

CHICAGO, April 13. (U.P.)—At least five men were killed and another was believed fatally hurt tonight when fire trapped more than a dozen workmen in an underground tunnel and defied efforts of firemen to rescue them.
