NOTICE OF SEWER BOND ELECTION

Notice is hereby given that pursuant to a Resolution adopted by the Board of County Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, at a recessed regular meeting thereof on the 13th day of April, 1931, there will be submitted to the vote of the regularly qualified electors of said City of Las Vegas, at the general city election, to be held on Tuesday, the 5th day of May, 1931, the question as to whether or not there shall be issued by the City of Las Vegas One Hundred Sixty Thousand Dollars of negotiable coupon LAS VEGAS SEWERAGE BONDS, for the purpose of securing money to construct a sewerage system in said City (including a disposal plant) and waste main therefrom.

Said bonds, if authorized at said election, will be of the denomination of One Thousand Dollars each and bear interest at the rate fixed by the successful bidder, but not to exceed seven per centum per annum, the interest on each bond to be payable semi-annually, on the 1st day of January and first day of July of each year. Said bonds will bear date the first day of July, 1931.

On the ballot at said general city election there shall be printed the words "Sewerage bonds—yes," and "Sewerage bonds—no," in parallel lines one above the other. The voter will cross out with voting stamp the word "Yes" if opposed to the bonds, and the word "No," if in favor of the issue.

PAPER-CLIP MOTOR HELPS TEACH ENGINEERING

PITTSBURGH, Pa. (AP) — With four paper clips, five thumbtacks and six feet of wire, Dominick Labino made an electric motor.

What is more, Labino's instructor in electrical engineering at Carnegie Institute of Technology says the result is a most effective exposition of the operation of electric motors, and will be useful in instruction.

They consider this paper-clip motor even more remarkable than Labino's "smallest motor in the world," which, weighing only 23 grains, took him eight months to build.

But the paper-clip motor—here's how it's done: Bend a clip so it forms a rough cross. The two rounded arms form the armature core, and the two ends the shafts on which the armature turns.

Taking a piece of wire (No. 22 is the best), lay one end along the "shaft," wind some first on one armature pole and then the other, bringing the free end back along the same side of the shaft as the end with which the winding was started. That makes the commutator.

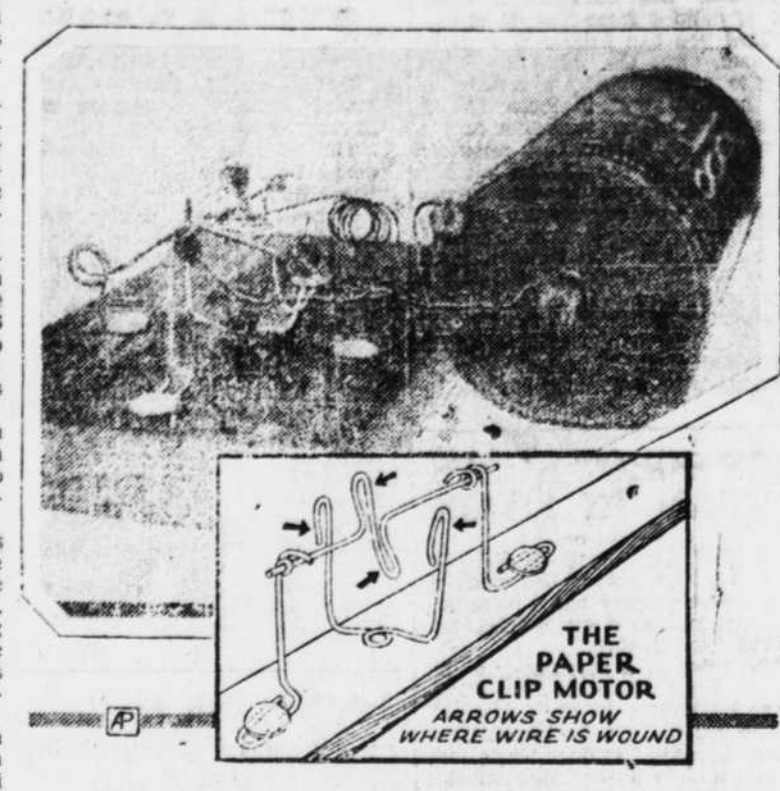
Bend two more clips to form bearings on which the armature can turn, mounting them on a board with thumb-tacks.

Bend still another clip into a broad, square, "U" shape, and mount it on the board with another tack so that the armature will turn within the uprights, or "field pieces."

Connect a piece of wire to a 1 1/2 volt battery, fasten it to the board with another tack, and coil the rest to form a spring so that the free end will bear on one of the wires of the armature along the shaft.

Make another similar coil-spring to bear on the other wire.

Take the free end and wrap it around one field pole and then the other, then connect to the battery. The motor then should run. If it doesn't try changing the position of the armature wires a little.



This little motor, made of bent paper clips and six feet of fine wire, by Dominick Labino, runs perfectly and is called by his instructors an effective illustration of the principle of motors.

USE ATTIC SPACE FOR SPARE ROOM OF THIS LITTLE HOUSE



This brick bungalow of English design embodies a roomier plan than the exterior indicates. For example, a spare bedroom occupies space otherwise lost as attic, large because of the pleasing roof treatment. The windows of this room break up the roof area interestingly. Certainly the effect is altogether pleasing for the simple plan has been given a transforming touch apparent in a glance at the exterior, particularly in the gable and the chimney surmounting it. Downstairs there are a living room, dining room, kitchen, hall and two bedrooms with a connecting bath. Each is cross-ventilated and has an adequate closet. The bedroom upstairs, not shown in the plan, is reached by a stair from the hall. The entrance is most inviting with its recessed door, which serves as a shelter in the absence of a porch and will be greatly appreciated on rainy days. A dark brick diamond panel in the peak of the gable effectively sets off the whole brick face. A solid course of brick is used for the lintel over each window. The two wood posts of the entrance recess are weathered gray natural wood, rough hewn. The roof is of slate or shingle in warm grays, burnt siennas and sepias. The house should set well back from the street, facing the south. While a lot 60 by 100 feet would be suitable, one 75 by 125 would allow more room for the lawn and shrubbery to develop a proper setting. The cost has been estimated from \$8,000 to \$10,000, depending on the quality of materials chosen and local material prices and labor scales.
