WASHINGTON. (A)-The "coldest" cold ever pro2 red in the United States, 456 degrees below zero Pahrenheit, has just been created at the Bureau of Standards.

That is seven times as cold as the weather bureau's record low winter temperature, 65 below. Scientists created this new low in the laboratory to turn helium gas into liquid, the first time this

been accomplished in the United States. Helium is the most difficult to

iquefy of all gases. It was liquefled as part of the bureau's experiments to see how various substances act at extremely low tempera ures. Dr. F. G. Brickwedde, J. W. Cook, R. B. Scott and J. M. worked together on the In liquefying helium, the sci-

entists approached within three and half degrees of "absolute zero," 459.4 degrees below zero Fahren-heit a cold never yet produced on earth. Helium liquefies at 452 below, but 456 was actually a tained during the experiment. Two substances several times as

cold as ice were used as the re-frigurants. First liquid air was to chill hydrogen gas into liquid. The liquid hydrogen in turn served to condense the helium. A series of heavily insulated metal cases, one inside the other,

served as the apparatus to liquefy helium, which flowed through 2 coil and was out under pressure of 200 pounds to the square inch. The studies may shed light on
