## LEAVITTE SPINS WAY TO MAT WIN OVER ARIZONAN

### Gob-Champ to 'Rassle Frenchy on Coming All Star Card

Marching on his honor-crushing way to his fame, Frenchy Leavitte with a never fading smile, won his third Vegas match last night by scoring two falls over Bob Neller in 33 minutes 45 seconds with the use of his now famous airplane spin, coupled with his fine exhibition of wrestling as could be seen anywhere.

Before the bout started Sailor Lewis, winner of the preceding bout, challenged the winner of the event.

**MAIN EVENT**  
They started out sparring for a hold when Bob began the rough stuff. Frenchy retaliated and threw Bob outside the ropes several times in succession. Frenchy finally got a leg split on Neller, which the latter broke only to be thrown out of the ropes again. At one time Bob seemed too slow in getting back into the ring and Frenchy seized him by the head and threw him back. There was a series of arm locks and leg holds for several minutes in which both shared the honors. Frenchy finally got Bob into an airplane spin and ended the fall in 23 minutes and 33 seconds.

The second fall at first promised to be a repetition of the first. Frenchy got a feeble airplane spin under way, which Bob survived. A few moments of rough stuff followed after which Frenchy again got the airplane hold, putting Bob down and out the second time in ten minutes and 16 seconds. Ted Janson refereed.

**SEMI-FINAL**  
Sailor Jack Lewis of the U. S. Navy and Jack O'Neill, local wrestler. Best two out of three, one hour time limit.

Started out with the Sailor putting a jack knife on O'Neill's arm and this was followed by a continuous succession of head locks and body slams. Sailor was given the decision. Time six minutes.

But O'Neill protested the decision claiming that he was not down. So the Sailor volunteered to proceed and finally won the fall in 19 minutes and 42 seconds.

The second fall also was won by the Sailor, who used the flying headlock and body slams so effectively that O'Neill was soon helpless. The time was 53 seconds. This was one of the fairest matches that could be seen anywhere. And all on the up and up, both men

giving a very good account of themselves.

**FIRST EVENT**  
Sammy Casper, of Casper, Wyo., and Cherokee Jack Rogers. Two best out of three, time limit 30 minutes.

The contest developed in a spirited bout. The first half was taken up with a series of half Nelsons and but little real action. The last fifteen minutes worked up some rough stuff and the bout went the full thirty minutes with no decision. Both grapplers had their strong adherents in the crowd and neither had any noticeable advantage. Eddie Johnson, former well-known ring star, refereed the semi-final and curtain raiser.

## KID BERG ADDS SCALP TO BELT

NEW YORK, May 8. (AP)—Jack Kid Berg, English lightweight, reaffirmed his right to high ranking in the lightweight class tonight when he pounded his way to a ten round decision over Tony Herrera of Mexico.  
The bout was Berg's first since his recent knockout by Lightweight Champion Tony Canzoneri, and the same little Britain made a fine showing.  
Herrera, an unheralded Mexican contender, gave Berg a real fight and won the sympathy of the nine thousand spectators. The decision was vigorously razed.

## GOLD RUSH ON AT YERINGTON

YERINGTON, Nev., May 8. (AP)—A new Nevada gold rush started today, and the town of Yerington was almost deserted. The latest placer gold strike reported is in Smith valley near the old Buckskin mine about 20 miles from here.  
More than 300 claims already have been staked. Free gold has been located in gravel beds that were not touched previously. One miner returned with a pickle jar of nuggets which he claimed was worth \$200.

## WINDSTORM RAGING BELOW EARTH HIT BY WELL DIGGERS

WOODBINE, Ia. (AP)—A windstorm issuing from the very bowels of the earth has resulted from the fifth futile effort to produce a water-bearing well on the farm of William Umphalbaugh near here.  
The "wind gusher" has been blowing steadily and with considerably force since a well-digging machine opened it up at a depth of 225 feet.  
When the wind broke loose there was about 60 feet of water in the well, but this has since disappeared. Some sand and gravel comes hurtling out of the mysterious bellows.
