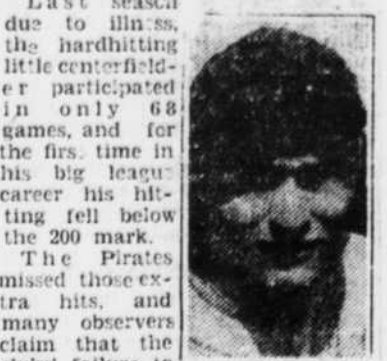

Last season due to illness, the hard hitting little centerfielder participated in only 68 games, and for the first time in his big league career his hitting fell below the 200 mark. The Pirates missed those extra hits, and many observers claim that the club's failure to finish in the first division was directly traceable to the long absence of "Little Poison" from the lineup.

This season, however, Waner appears as good as new. Leading off for the club, he has jumped near the top in the number of runs scored.

Lloyd joined the Pirates and his brother Paul Waner, "Big Poison" of the slugging Waners, in 1927. He immediately became one of the most dangerous hitters in the big time.

George Dodgen of Shamrock, Tex., played a golf course in one. He dubbed his drive on No. 1 and the ball rolled into the cup on No. 9.

Stone Studies His Timing And Hits 'Em For Detroit



John Stone is hitting the ball for Detroit. Back in 1929 he was weak at the plate but recently Bucky Harris has given him a course in timing his swing. The results are bounteous.

DETROIT (AP)—Jonathan Thomas Stone, pride of Mulberry, Tenn., and the Detroit Bluecheries, has turned out to be Manager Bucky Harris' timing man piece of the 1931 baseball season.

He has repaid Harris' faith in his ability and promises to become one of Detroit's immortals.

Although labelled by Detroit scouts as a big "find" when he joined the Tiger forces in 1929, Stone failed miserably at the bat, and for a time he was benched. Then last year, after a short stay on the sidelines, he came back by riding the ball for a .313 average in 126 games.

"But you're a better hitter than that," Manager Harris shouted. "Study timing and you'll be a great hitter."

So under Harris' personal instruction Stone began to study timing in the 1931 spring training camp. He kept his long grip on the bat, but he watched the pitcher more closely and started his swing a little sooner.

Results were bounteous. In his first 12 games many of his line smashes were stopped by great fielding, but he hammered out five home runs to get an even start with Rogers Hornsby of the Cubs for the home run championship race.
