The enthusiastic Hillig, a German-born citizen, who is financing the flight, is the spokesman. Hoiris, born in Denmark, is a silent chap who would rather fly than talk...

"We are not going to be hurried," he will wait at Harbor Grace, Newfoundland, until we get the best possible weather. So what's there to worry about? I will be a great adventure."

They have proved the ship's speed at 110 miles per hour, giving them an estimate of twenty-eight hours from Harbor Grace to Copenhagen, 3,100 miles away.

Helping the Homemaker

- Vegetable Salad: 1 cup sliced tomatoes, 1/2 cup chopped cabbage, 1/2 cup chopped carrots, 2 tablespoons chopped green peppers, 1-3 cup sliced radishes, 1 tablespoon chopped onions, 1/2 cup French dressing, Mix ingredients. Cover with plate and chill several hours. Mix well and serve on lettuce.

Strawberry Surprise Cake

- 1 1/2 cups pastry flour, 3 teaspoons baking powder, 1/2 cup sugar, 1 teaspoon vanilla, 1 egg, 1/2 cup milk, 4 tablespoons butter, melted. Mix ingredients and beat three minutes. Pour into two small layer cake pans and bake twenty minutes in moderate oven. Add filling.

Filling

- 1/2 cup sugar, 4 tablespoons flour, 2 egg yolks, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1 cup milk, 1 teaspoon vanilla, 1 tablespoon butter, melted, 2 egg whites, beaten. Blend sugar and flour. Add yolks, salt and milk. Cook in double boiler until very creamy. Beat two minutes. Fold in rest of the ingredients. Cool. Use as filling between two cake layers and spread with two cups of berries which have been mixed with 1/2 cup sugar.

AIR FETE WILL OPEN FIELD AT ALABAMA TOWN

BIRMINGHAM, Ala., May 22. (AP)—Industrial Birmingham is going air-minded during a three-day celebration dedicating the city's new airport, beginning May 30.

Booked as the south's outstanding aeronautical event of the year, the million-dollar development will be placed in service with a series of demonstrations and the inauguration of a new airmail and passenger line.

Major Jimmie Doolittle, former army flier; Eddie Stinson, plane manufacturer; Mrs. Phoebe Omie, Assis. Postmaster General Glover and other noted pilots and officials have accepted invitations to attend.

American Airways will inaugurate the southern transcontinental airmail and passenger service, establishing Birmingham as a point on its New York-Los Angeles lines.

The airport covers 325 acres of flat terrain, is three-quarters of a mile long from corner to corner, and offers a quarter-mile landing area.
