the 1931 and 1929 Hoover efforts to curb army expenditures. In 1929 the treasury was worrying about a surplus of some \$100,000,000, later translated by congress into an income tax cut. In 1931 a deficit painfully close to the billion dollar mark must be met.

It remains to be seen what sort of project Hurley and MacArthur can work out that will cut army costs without also cutting the size or effectiveness of the regular service.

WEEKS' REVOLT

President Coolidge had his intransigent army cost-powwow back in his first days at the White House. He used direct methods, however, decreasing by the budget bureau the lopping off of five or ten thousand men. Secretary Weeks revolted. He virtually threatened to resign unless that cut was recalled, and he won out.

Another Hoover guest at the latest army cost-powwow was Representative Will Wood of Indiana, presumably to head the house appropriations committee. But will he, or should Mr. Hoover have invited Representative Joe Byrnes, Tennessee Democrat?

SONS OF KING AND MUSSOLINI TRAINING FOR POWER IN FOOTSTEPS OF THEIR FATHERS

ROME, May 23. (AP)—In marked contradiction to the United States, where presidents' sons go to business schools and sons of banking families are orchestra leaders, the sons of most Italian leaders plan lives like those of their fathers.

Prince Umberto and Bruno Mussolini, Italy's most famous sons of famous fathers, are treading the exact footsteps their parents took before them.

The prince, who will one day rule Italy from the throne of his father, King Victor Emmanuel, is getting a thorough training in court and military life.

He is a full colonel of a line regiment, stationed at Turin and will fill as a practical officer, the post of commander in chief of the Italian armies. His career was cut out for him at birth, as was his father's.

Bruno, 13-year-old son of the Duce, has embraced early the same career that led his father to his post as head of the Italian government and founder and leader of fascism.

Already he is an editor. A short time ago he founded a paper, "The Boys' Pen," which has a gross circulation among fascist youths.

He is a member of the "Advance Guard," a division of the uniformed forces of his father, and is getting a sound background of fascist political thought. He will undoubtedly hold a governmental post when he grows older.

Another example is the career of Galeazzo Ciano, son of minister of communications and son-in-law of Mussolini. While not yet holding a portfolio, he is carving a career in his government's service. He has chosen diplomacy and is at present stationed at Shanghai.

Other cases of sons following their fathers into the government are somewhat harder to find, since most of Mussolini's aids are young men, well on the sunny side of 50, and their sons, if they have them, are still in the romper stage.

GROUP HONORS Youthful Mathematics Wizard Is Lauded As He Starts Broadcast

NEW HAVEN, Conn., May 23. (AP)—Music lovers will gather tomorrow before an old ivy-covered house at 40 Trumbull street where Ehelbert Nevin wrote "The Rosary" and where he died on February 17, 1901.

In an appropriately simple ceremony, the widow of the composer will unveil a copper plaque placed between the tall windows of the room in which Nevin breathed his last.

The tablet is inscribed: "In memory of Ehelbert Nevin, who died in this house February 17, 1901. This tablet placed by the Connecticut State Federation of Music Clubs."

The Nevin's, Ehelbert, his wife, and their two children, Paul and Doris, came here early in 1900 from New York. He was born in Edgeworth, Pa. Although he had been a social light in New York, he lived simply in the small apartment. He moved his piano into the parlor downstairs and did most of his composing there.

Robert Cameron Rogers, here as a Yale student, wrote the words of "The Rosary," the song which gained Nevin undying fame.

The composer's life here is commemorated by more than the tablet. Mrs. Frank Crown, who occupies the house, has gathered what is probably the most complete collection of Nevin relics.

Miss Flora Calhoun, a neighbor, remembers him as a frail man who played the piano and always had a biscuit—usually a single narcissus, near him.
