Under the navigation laws of the United States the tariff commission reports, an alien is not permitted to be owner or master of a fishing vessel of five net tons or more. No coastal state or territory denies an alien the right to own a fishing vessel.

GLENDICK TO START MINES

ST. ANDREAS, Cal., May 23.—The Glendick Mines corporation, a Los Angeles concern, has acquired, under lease and bond, from J. S. McDonald the Yellow Aster mine on the Calaveras county side of the Mokelumne river, five miles north of West Point, and inaugurated operations, under the supervision of H. R. Derrer, Los Angeles mining man. A 500-foot drift tunnel, extended in the early days, is being continued on about two-foot face of ore assaying, it is stated, \$40 a ton in gold, at a point about 150 feet from the portal of the tunnel a raise has been started on 10 inches of ore which is said to average \$140 a ton in gold. The property is equipped with a three-stand mill.

EXTEND PROSPECTING

John Morris and associates of Los Angeles, who are operating several placer gravel properties in Tuolumne county, have extended their investigations to Calaveras county. They have taken under lease and bond from W. H. Luddy and A. L. Wylie six parcels of placer ground approximating 844 acres, about three miles southwest of San Andreas. Snider and V. V. Gee of Long Beach, Cal. Past surface operations have resulted in the exposure of several promising lode showings, it is stated.

Helping the Homemaker

- Fresh Berries and Confectioner's Sugar
Cheese Timbales and Asparagus Tips
Hot Biscuit Plum Jelly
Stuffed Tomato Salads
Orange Sherbet Marshmallow Balls Coffee

- CHEESE TIMBALES, SERVING 8
2 cups soft bread crumbs
1 cup cheese, cut fine
2 cups milk
4 egg yolks
1 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon paprika
2 tablespoons finely chopped celery
1 tablespoon finely chopped onions

- 2 tablespoons chopped pimientos
4 egg whites, beaten
Mix crumbs, cheese, milk and yolks. Let stand five minutes. Mix well and add rest of ingredients. Four into small buttered molds. Set in pan of water.

- Bake 25 minutes in moderate oven. Unmold carefully and surround with asparagus tips.

- ASPARAGUS TIPS
32 asparagus tips (4 inches long)
3 tablespoons butter
4 tablespoons flour
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon paprika
2 cups milk
1 egg yolk, beaten

- Melt butter and add flour, salt and paprika. Add milk and cook until thick sauce forms. Stir constantly. Add yolk, mix well and pour over asparagus tips, which have been cooked and arranged about timbales. Garnish with parsley and serve at once.

- STUFFED TOMATO SALAD
2 firm and medium sized tomatoes
1 cup diced cucumbers
1/2 cup diced celery
1/2 cup chopped green peppers
2 tablespoons chopped onions
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon paprika
1 cup stiff mayonnaise

- Chill all ingredients. Peel and remove cores from tomatoes. Mix two tablespoons of mayonnaise with vegetables and seasonings. Stuff tomato cases. Serve in lettuce and top with rest of mayonnaise.

- MARSHMALLOW BALLS
Bake white cake mixture in small muffin pans. When cool, remove centers and stuff with marshmallows. Frost tops and sides with thick creamy frosting. Sprinkle
