A pilot must shut off the power at least 1.968 feet in the air and land within 492 feet of a fixed point without damage to his plane.

His skill is tested by turns around buoys or posts and a series of five figure-of-eight turns between the markers. During the tests he neither can touch land nor water nor be higher than 656 feet.

One of the tests for a seaplane candidate is to approach a seaplane with a rowboat.


