## DOUBLE MAIN EVENT TO HOLD LEGION SPOT ON FRIDAY'S MAT CARNIVAL

### Ladies Again Will Be Admitted Free At Grapple Party

Ladies will be admitted free with escorts at Friday night's all-star wrestling card at the Legion stadium.

#### DOUBLE MAIN EVENT

A double main event is carded by the Legion's matchmaker for Friday's program and the feature event shows Charley Mason, the Seattle sensation, and Big John Erickson, the giant of the Boulder dam.

The other half of the double main event shows Frenchie Leavitt, one of the world's cleverest grapplers and Tom Roy of Omaha.

Charley Mason and Erickson, the man-mountain of the dam camps, are the greatest grapplers ever presented in a contest in a Nevada ring.

Mason, one of the best wrestlers that ever crawled on a mat in a northwest ring, will pit his knowledge gained in meeting some of the world's best wrestlers, against his opponent John Erickson, who has been conditioning himself in the Boulder dam mountains.

Erickson, one of the world's most powerful men, will match his rough, tough style against the cleverness of his opponent, the Seattle wizard, Charley Mason.

Leavitt, the man of a thousand holds, and a favorite of the Las Vegas fans, clashes with the Omaha phantom, Tom Roy.

Roy claims to be just twice as rough as Frenchie and says he has as many holds to offer as Mr. Leavitt dares to clamp on him.

**IS LEG WRESTLER**  
Frenchie is said to be the greatest leg wrestler in the west and Roy says he has as many arm and body holds as the great Leavitt has to offer.

Roy is in condition to crowd Frenchie from the first bell and is rated a 10 to 8 favorite.

**MANY BACKERS**  
Betting has been very light on Erickson and Mason but Tom Roy has many Omaha backers laying odds he will defeat Frenchie in straight falls Friday.
