3 of Ordiannce No.166 of the City The Board of Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas Do Ordain as

Section 1. Section 3 of Ordinance

No. 166 of the City o. L. entitled "An Ordinance of the City, of Las Vegas regulating tion, construction, enlargement, al teration, repair, moving, removal, demolition, conversion, occupancy. equipment, use, height, area, and maintenance, of all buildings and or structure in the City of Las Vegas; providing for the issuance of Permits, and collection of fees therefor; providing penalties for the violation thereof; declaring and establishing Fire Zones; Repealing Ordinances Nos. 144-27-59-61 and 72 of the City of Las Vegas and all other Ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict therewith" be and the same is hereby amended so that the same shall read as follows:

"Section 3. That, the entire incorporated area of the City of Las Vegas is hereby declared to be and is established as a Fire District and said Fire District shall be known and designated as Fire Zones 2 and 3, and each such zone shall include such territory or portions of said City as illustrated, on lined and designated on a certain map on file in the office of the City Clerk of the City of Las Vegas, being marked and designated as "Fire Zones of the City of Las Vegas, as amended in connection with Ordinance No. 169 of said City," which is hereby adopted as the fire zoning map of the City of Las Vegas for the application of the regulations included in the "Uniform Building Code, 1930 Edition, published May 1930, by Pacific Coast Building Officials Conference."




