R. F. WILLIAMS BEATEN AND SLASHED HERE

Jack Riley Held After Cutting Affray Late Last Evening

Wounded Man Says Attacker Used Fruit Knife as Weapon

R. F. Williams, 40, a Las Vegas laborer, was at his cabin home today recovering from a severe and painful stab wound and Jack Riley, 32, was being held in the city jail.

FACE SLASHED

Officers investigating the cutting scrape found Williams bleeding badly from severe gashes about his face, and rushed him to the Las Vegas hospital where several stitches were necessary to close the wounds.

GRABS KNIFE

As the men weaved to and fro and dashed about the small room, Riley is alleged to have grabbed up a paring knife from the table and stabbed Williams three times, once across the nose, the cheek and on the jaw.
