HOPE TO WIN ON HUDSON

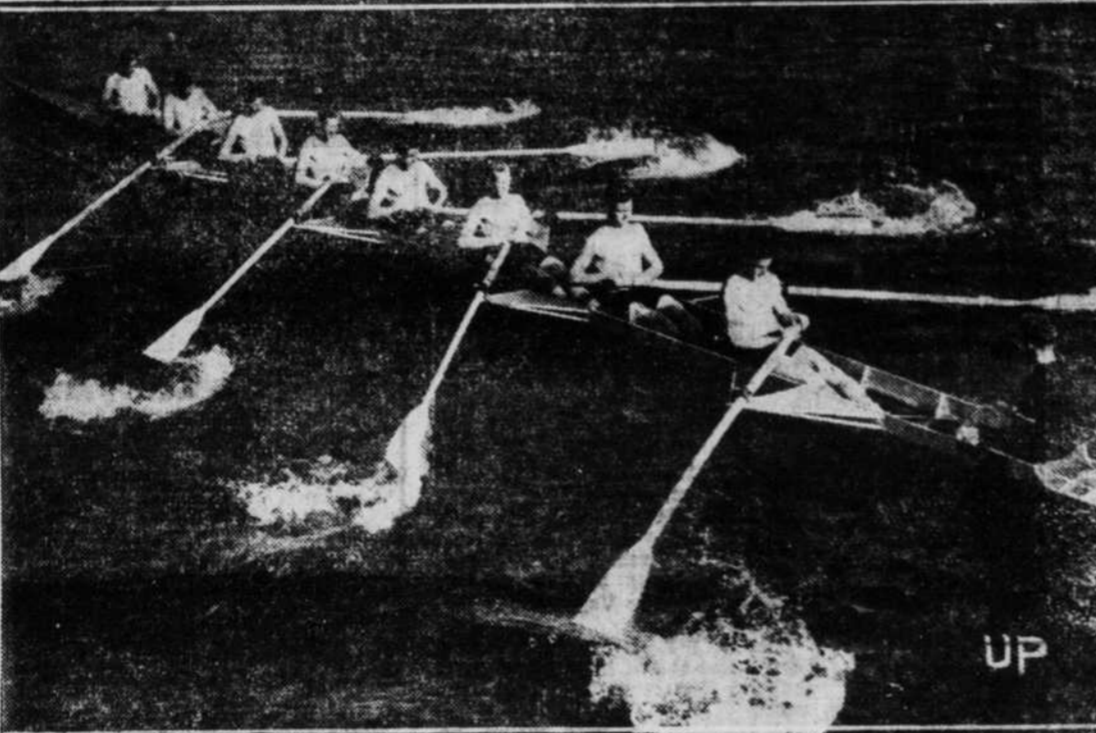
