JACK SAYS HE'S GOOD

RENO, June 5 —According to an announcement today by Jack Dempsey, promoter, Max Baer, California heavyweight, will start heavy training Friday morning for his 20-round battle here on the morning of July 4 with Pauline Uzdunin.

Baer's training camp will be at Lawton Springs, five miles from Reno, on the main highway between this city and the Truckee however, at the Hayberry ranch about two miles from Lawton Springs, in order that the big Livmore Leveler can be away from the crowds when not actually working out.

Jack Dempsey is much impressed with Max's evident sincerity in wanting to be in tip-top physical condition for the bruising battle with Pauline.

Baer voluntarily came to Reno a week ahead of schedule and wanted to go into training immediately. But because of the danger of going "stale" through too long a conditioning siege, delayed the usual start of the regular workout for several days on Dempsey's advice.

Since arriving here last Thursday however, Max has engaged in long mountain hikes, played golf and gone swimming daily as a preliminary to becoming used to the high altitude and different climatic conditions.

"Max means business," says Jack. "His friends around the San Francisco bay district who believe he has the makings of a heavyweight champion need not worry about Max being in the best shape he has ever been in for a fight. He will have to be to go twenty rounds with Pauline—and Max himself realizes it better than anybody else."

Spectators sometimes feel sorry for Ben Eastman, Stanford university's sophomore runner. The sympathy is wasted for few athletes need it less than Coach Link Templeton's prize performer, a tall, gangling lad with sandy hair and large shell rimmed spectacles. He appears awkward and perhaps anemic. He is neither.

The boy who recently tied Ted Meredith's 15 year old mark of 47.4 seconds for the quarter mile around two turns, looks little like a great runner in his warming up efforts. Once the battle of the track is on, the spectators' sympathy shifts to the rest of the field, for his long rhythmic strides immediately take him into a lead which he has relinquished only once this year.

In many respects Eastman's form resembles that of Paavo Nurmi. He quickly assumes his stride at a pace which none of his competitors can match. He knows just what he can do, and goes out to accomplish that task, as nearly obvious to the activities of others as is possible in a spirited 440 yard dash.

NO GARRISON FINISH
He makes no sprint finish, but instead merely quickens his effortless stride which sends him to the tape ahead of his opponents. Lack of experience in the half is his only apparent handicap in the longer event. Here also he quickly moves to the front, setting such a pace that no

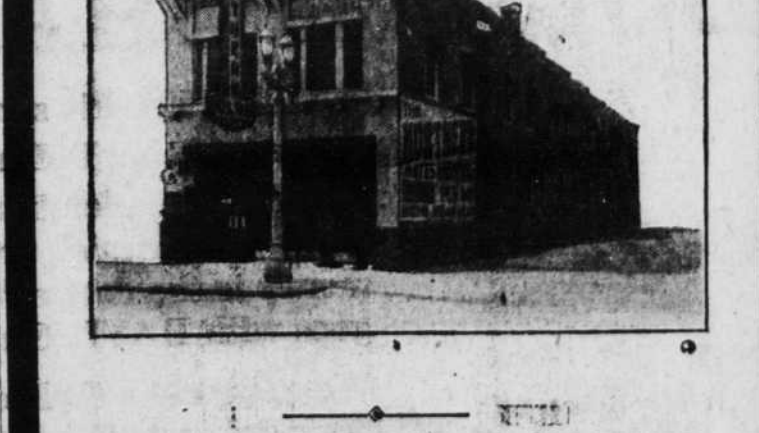
