DAIRY GROUPS PLANNED FOR THIS AREA

Stimulated by the new non-profit cooperative marketing act passed by the last Nevada legislature, three new cooperative agricultural marketing associations have been organized recently within the state and three others are in process of formation, according to information reaching the Nevada agricultural extension service.

THEIR OBJECTIVES All the cooperatives have as their objectives the grading and standardizing of their product and the stabilizing of the market so that the consumer will be assured of a good commodity at a reasonable price and the farmer of a normal profit.

FIRST TO TAKE ADVANTAGE OF THE new law, which conforms to the federal act governing the same activities, was the Nevada Turkey Growers' association, through which are marketed most of the holiday birds produced in this state. Just having completed reorganization, which places it under the provisions of the new state law, is the Western Nevada Poultry Producers. Also organized is the Nevada Honey Producers' association, which came into being as a result of action on the part of farmers in southern Lyon county last month. For the time, the activities of beekeepers will be limited to the western part of the state, but eventually they hope to expand their operations to the rest of Nevada.

MILK PRODUCERS Preliminary meetings have been held looking toward the formation of the Southern Nevada Milk Producers' association, which, when organized, will market cooperatively dairy products of Clark and Lincoln counties. Eventually poultry and poultry products may be added to the association's activities.

TO STIMULATE THE uniform production of a high quality hay, farmers in Churchill county recently proposed a cooperative marketing association of hay producers in the western part of the state. Sentiment is strong for the association. It is understood.

PLANS ARE NOW UNDER way for the organization of the Nevada Potato Growers' association, with the initiative being taken by the Lyon county farmers, who have a loose organization.

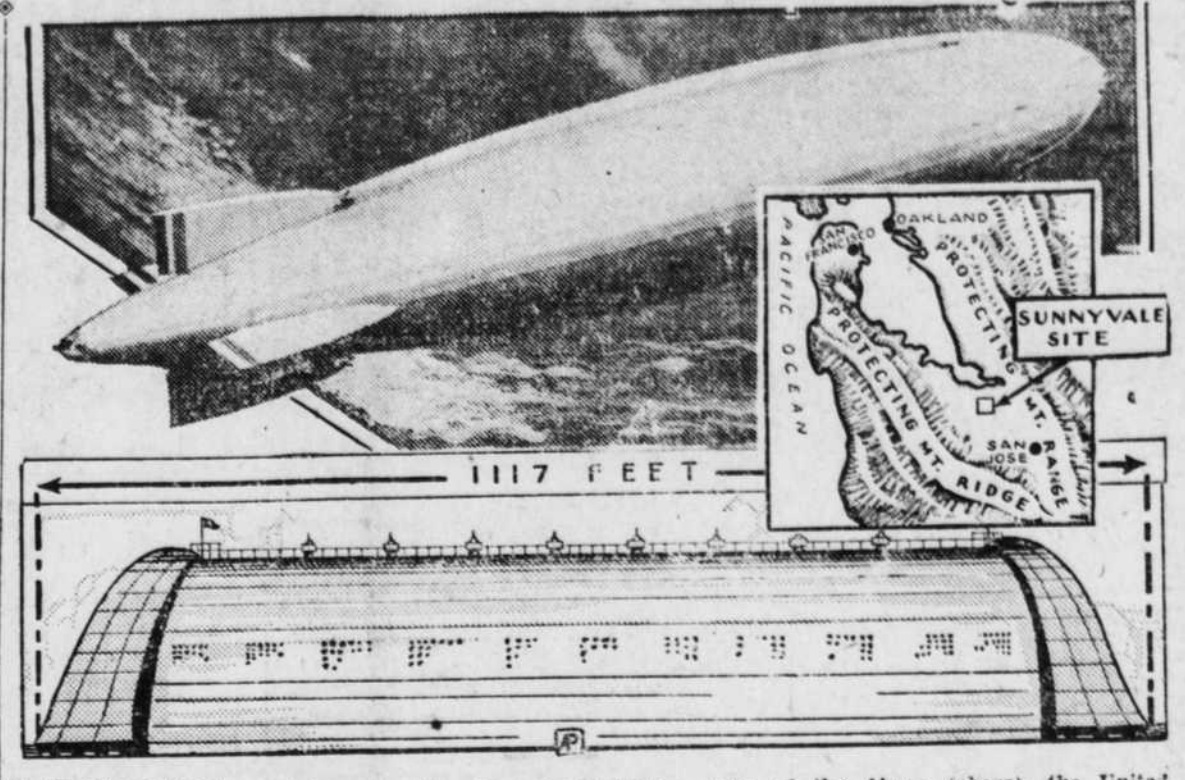

U. S. TO BUILD \$5,000,000 "DIRIGIBLE CITY" AS PACIFIC BASE FOR AKRON'S GIANT TSISTER

By W. A. WELLS SUNNYVALE, Cal., June 8. (AP)—To give "eyes" to the United States battle fleet in its patrol of the west coast, expenditure of \$5,000,000 for the creation of a lighter-than-air naval base near here is scheduled to begin in July. Specifications for the project are being completed for mailing to contractors from whom bids are invited. A hangar costing \$2,200,000 for the housing of the authorized dirigible ZRS-5—twin of the Akron, largest airship ever constructed—is included in the Sunnyvale program. Nearby will be built a "dirigible city" providing administrative quarters and housing accommodations for 500 officers and men, 33 buildings in all. Peace time duty of the new helium-inflated craft will consist chiefly of cooperating with the navy's fighting craft in fleet maneuvers. With a top speed of 83 to 85 miles an hour, cruising radius of 6,000 miles, the ZRS-5 will be able theoretically to accompany the fleet the full length of the "Pacific frontier"—an imaginary line from Dutch Harbor, Alaska, to Panama, skirting the Hawaiian islands. Auxiliary buildings on the 1,000-acre naval base site, given to the government by the San Francisco and other chambers of commerce, will include \$170,000 power plant, a \$295,000 helium storage plant, a \$108,000 helium repurification plant and a \$95,000 water system. The Sunnyvale site was declared by Rear Admiral William A. Moffett to have ideal physical characteristics, being protected by mountain ranges to the west, east and south and being capable of defense from enemy sea craft. Both the Akron and the ZRS-5 will have gross lifts of 400,000 lbs., including the weight of the ship itself. They are powered by eight 500 horsepower engines, with a complement of eighteen officers and sixty-four men each. The Sunnyvale hangar will differ little in design from that at Lakehurst, which will house the Akron. It will be 1,117 feet long, 308 feet wide and have an inside vertical clearance of 180 feet. The main doors, two at each end, will weigh 500 tons each and are to be operated by 125 h. p. motors. Lieutenant Commander E. L. Marshall, C. E. corps, will supervise the construction of the base.
