## Helping the Homemaker

By LOUISE BENNETT WEAVER EGG PLANT FOR DINNER

**The Dinner Menu**  
Broiled Veal Chops  
Buttered New Potatoes  
Egg Plant Lenox  
Bread Peach Jam  
Stuffed Tomato Salad  
Cherry Pudding Coffee

**Broiled Veal Chops**  
6 chops, cut 2-3 inch thick  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
1/2 teaspoon paprika  
2 tablespoons finely chopped parsley  
3 tablespoons lemon juice  
Wipe off chops with damp cloth. Put into frying pan and broil ten minutes. Turn and broil other sides ten minutes. Baste several times during cooking. Sprinkle with rest of ingredients. Broil two minutes. Serve at once.

**Egg Plant Lenox**  
1 egg plant  
3 teaspoons salt  
2 egg yolks  
2 tablespoons cold water  
1 cup crumbs  
4 tablespoons fat  
4 tablespoons chopped cheese

Wash egg plant. Cut in slices 1-3 inch thick. Cut crossways. Peel. Sprinkle with salt and lay slices on top of each other. Weight it down with fish. Let stand one hour. Remove slices and rinse well. Dip in yolks which have been mixed with cold water. Dip in crumbs. Heat fat in frying pan, add and brown egg plant. Sprinkle with cheese and let cook three minutes. Serve on platter. Garnish with parsley.

**Cherry Pudding**  
2 cups flour  
4 teaspoons baking powder  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
2 tablespoons sugar  
4 tablespoons butter  
2-3 cup milk

Mix flour, baking powder, salt and sugar. Cut in butter with knife. Mixing with knife, add milk. When soft dough forms, pat it to thickness of one inch. Place in shallow, greased baking pan. Spread with cherry mixture.

**Cherry Mixture**  
2 cups seeded red cherries  
1/2 cup sugar  
2 tablespoons flour  
1/2 teaspoon cinnamon  
2 tablespoons butter

Mix ingredients. Spread on top soft dough. Bake twenty minutes in moderate oven. Cut in bars and serve warm.  
Lemon, cherry or vanilla sauce or plain or whipped cream can be served with this pudding.  
Other fresh or canned fruits can be used in place of the cherries.

### SCREEN LIFE IN HOLLYWOOD

By HUBBARD KEAVY HOLLYWOOD—Does medal renting sound like a business? It didn't to me either, so I investigated.

This industry came into being several years ago when a young fellow, about 25 now, named A. W. Hazelton, a collector, staked a former Russian general to a square meal and became the owner of a gold medal as thanks.

Since then dozens of ex-officers of many armies, principally the Balkan, Russian, Austrian and German, have left Hazelton's office with coin or currency in exchange for medals of honor.

This coin collector's charity has developed into a business that sees a turnover of several thousands monthly. Hazelton rents his medals to the movie studios at prices ranging from \$1.25 to \$75 a week.

The most costly of medals is the British army's Victoria cross, which sells for \$875 at auction and rents for \$50, plus a deposit of \$500. Hazelton finds he can purchase as many croix de guerres as he wants from destitute heroes at \$2.50 each.

No one can buy American medals.

Hazelton says, since there is a law which prohibits commercial traffic in army and navy decorations, the medal of honor, if it were purchasable, would fetch \$1,000 and rent for \$75 a week.

#### RED TAPE

Before a medal of honor can be used for picture purposes, special permission must be obtained from the war department. Then the decoration must be returned to its owner at the end of each day's use. Any violation of this ruling is subject to a heavy fine.

The Russian order of St. Alexander Nevski and the Russian white eagle rent for \$25 weekly. These are the two most popular decorations used in the movies.

The most beautiful decoration of all, Hazelton believes, is the Grecian robe de guerre. The plainest are the American striking.

Hollywood might fake its medals; it doesn't. So renting the real ones is a very profitable business.
