STEAM ENGINE IS GIVEN TO SOCIETY

BOSTON, June 12 (U.P.)—What is believed to be the first miniature steam engine built in America has come into possession of the Society for the Preservation of New England Antiquities. The locomotive, built in 1829, was the gift of Misses Carrie and Nellie Allen of this city. Designed by Andrew J. Allen, their grandfather, and constructed by William T. James of New York, the tiny engine created a sensation here at the Mechanics' Exhibition of 1837. It is about three feet high, with an 18-inch gauge.
