IMPERIAL RUSSIAN WILL MAKE BOW TO MATFANS IN FRIDAY'S PROGRAM

Franco-Russ Bout Has International Flavor

Count Karl Micheli of Russia will meet Frenchie "The Great" Leavitt in a finish match, two falls out of three, at the Legion stadium. The other half of the double main event features Mountain John Erickson, the Boulder dam cyclone, and Young Frank Gotch of Des Moines, Iowa, in a two out of three fall match.

CZAR'S GUARD

The Legion promoter has been very fortunate in securing the services of Count Karl Micheli, a former member of the czar's imperial regiment, as the feature attraction of Friday night's wrestling card.

Count Micheli has a five-year plan of his own. He hopes to become world's wrestling champion within five years and take the championship belt to his home in

Russia (if they let him back) and retire undefeated champion.

Count Karl is the greatest wrestling attraction ever to appear in a Nevada ring.

The count must be rated a favorite over Frenchie Leavitt because of his past victories over some of the world's leading wrestlers.

SENSATIONAL BOUT

Frenchie Leavitt and Micheli should be the most sensational match ever witnessed here. RACE MIXTURE IS DISCUSSED

PASADENA, June 15 (AP)—The intermingling of races tends to stimulate progress, members of the American Association for the Advancement of Science were told tonight by Dr. Franz Boas, president of the association and professor of anthropology at Columbia University.

"The infusion of new blood," the 73-year-old scientist said in a long address, "generally leads to an improved biological and psychological status of the race."

Dr. Boas said that America might well pause, when speaking about the intermingling of European types, since such mingling generally has produced the strongest people.

"It is interesting to note," he stated, "that Spain's greatness followed the period of greatest race mixture and decline started when the population became stable and immigration stopped." Dr. Boas' address was given in Griffith Bowl and concluded a day of papers read by various members of the twenty-fourth section of the association.

BATTALINO IS BATTO WINNER

HARTFORD Conn., June 14 (AP)—Battling Battalino of Hartford, featherweight champion, knocked out Johnny Batto of Cleveland in the fifth round of a non-title bout tonight, after being knocked down for an eight count in the second round.
