Certainly most of us come to the task of parenthood less wise, less mature, less fit in every way than we should be.

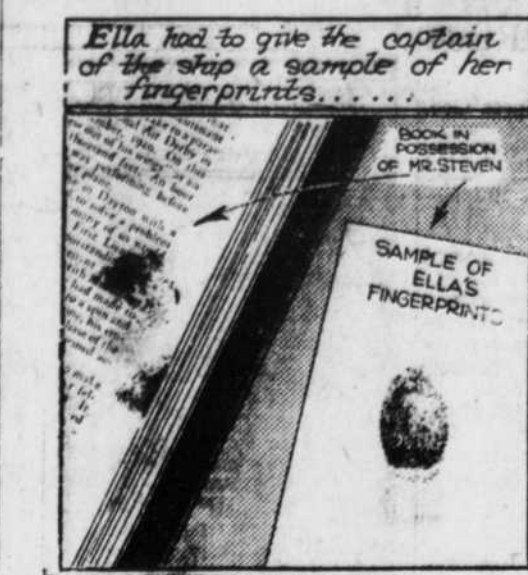
It is well for every parent honestly to criticize his behavior in the light of all that he knows and all that he can possibly learn...
