## COLLEGE COST IS ADDED UP Pupil's Record Is Said Perfect

WELLESLEY, Mass., June 19 (AP)—It costs the average girl \$2,238 a year to go to Wellesley College. A survey among students revealed this figure, which is \$370 above the yearly average of 1926.

SALEM, Ore., June 19 (AP)—Ernest Gerig, 14, was neither tardy nor absent at any time since he started attending school eight years ago.

The track experts who are content with a runner who comes from behind in his track efforts to win are wondering what Victor Williams, University of Southern California quarter-miler, could do if he were to distribute the burst of speed he shows at the finish over his entire race.

Williams, who incidentally is the National A. A. U. quarter-mile champion, spurred from far in the rear in the I. C. A. A. A. classic at Philadelphia to win the race and tie Ted Meredith's world record of 47.4.

A number of well known coaches, including Boyd Comstock of the Los Angeles Athletic club, for whom Williams has run, and Henry F. Schulte of Nebraska, contend that Williams would still have a slight reserve left, which might carry him to a new record should he set out to burn up the first part of his race.

A short, stocky lad, Williams depends a great deal on nerve for his fighting finishes, but in the case of his races with Ben Eastman on the Pacific coast the Stanford boy always had too much of an advantage when the Trojan made his bid.

## PAULINO TAKES NO CHANCE ON WIND

RENO, June 19.—Paulino Uzundun is taking no chances on not being properly acclimated when he enters the ring for his 20-round battle with Max Baer on July 4.

Ability to broad jump great distances may be inherited. Dick Barber, the University of Southern California star, is the son of a great jumper of another generation. His father, Walter Barber, was a middle west star at Iowa State from 1904 through 1907. In his senior year he set a record of 22 feet, 10 inches.

The younger Barber is just a youngster who will not celebrate his 21st birthday until July 24. He has been competing in track events since 1927. He lost to Frank Wykoff now the world famous sprinter, in the broad jump when he was at Long Beach Poly and Wykoff was the star of Glendale high, but he went on from there to set a California interscholastic record of 23 feet.

He has tremendous speed on the runway and a natural spring. He is said to be one of the three fastest men at Southern California in the 220 yard dash, and Coach Dean Cromwell frequently uses him to pace the 440 men.

Many Pacific coast observers think Barber will pass the world's record of 26 feet, 1/4 inch.

The elder Barber is secretary of the Long Beach board of education.

Uzundun hails from the Pyrenees mountains of Spain; about 18 years of his existence—before he became a boxer—was spent in the high altitudes. But the Basque is taking no chances on the altitude bothering him on July 4. Almost every morning he is out of bed an hour or two before his sparring mates and already has put in several miles of roadwork before they join him.

As promoter of the Independence Day fight, Jack is personally interested in seeing that both fighters are in shape to withstand the full 20 rounds. So hard-ly a day passes that Jack does not drop in on both principals to see how they are progressing in their conditioning.

Paulino is working nine and ten rounds each day with sparring partners, besides his other training activities—shadow boxing, rope skipping, light and heavy bag work, and eight or nine sparring partners and their instructions are to tear into Paulino with all they have.

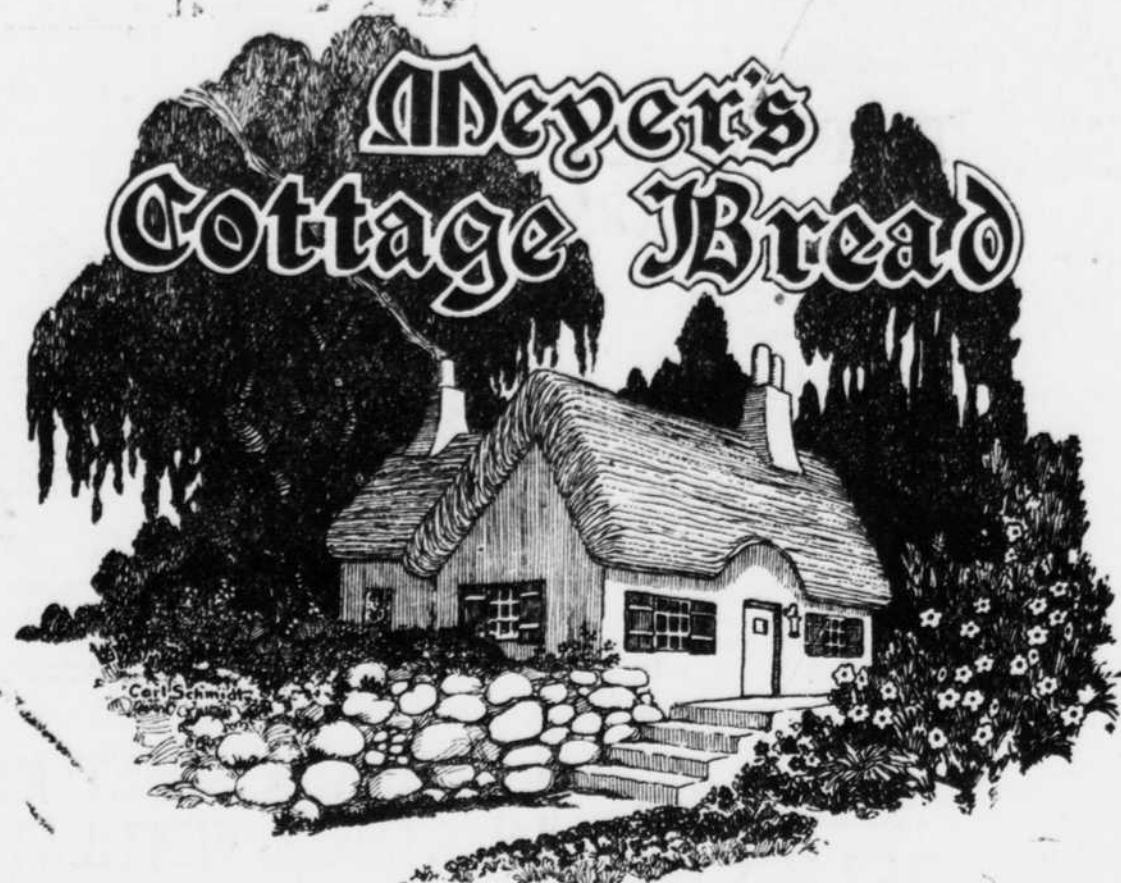

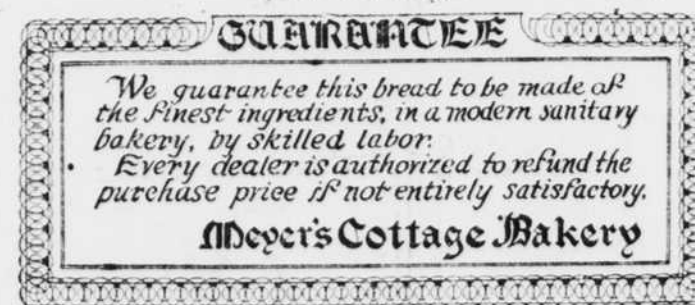
