NEW PROBLEM FACING EINSTEIN; REFUSES TO POSE FOR CINEMA

PASADENA, Cal., Jan. 1. (UP) — The maze into which the deep-thinking Dr. Albert Einstein will venture during his three-month sojourn here this year is unifying gravitational electricity into one integral theory.

The noted German physicist, who arrived here today from Berlin with Frau Einstein, explained this to half a hundred newspapermen as the purpose of his visit, but he added the word "beautifying" to the problem.

It is only in recent years that the connection between electricity, the cosmos and matter has been presumed, it was explained, and now the big problem is to mathematically connect them just as he did the concepts of the universe, curvature of space, and time.

The layman could see little beautiful in an intricate equation, but the mind of the gray-haired little scientist apparently saw beauty on every hand.

This year Dr. Einstein will spend weeks in consultation with the noted Dutch astronomer, Willem De Sitter, of the University of Leyden, who came here to the Mt. Wilson observatory several months ago.

Dr. Sitter has been regarded as a dissenter from Einstein's theory that the universe is expanding at a tremendous rate. De Sitter, however, declared that "we are not so far apart as some people suppose," and those close to the scientists believe they will come to an agreement on relativity.

Dr. Richard Chace Tolman, and Dr. Edwin P. Hubble of the Carnegie institution observatory at Mount Wilson, have offered new theories on the making of the universe during the past year, and they will reveal them to Einstein during weekly seminars.

Dr. Hubble is the observer of the red-shift in light rays, and he decided that distant nebulae were receding from the earth at a speed of 11,000 miles a second.

Dr. Tolman, the mathematician, interpreted this discovery as an indication that the universe is expanding with explosive force. Einstein combined their work with his own and evolved a mathematical formula to explain the action.

Yet while praising the work of Tolman and the Abbe Lemaitre of Belgium in clarifying the theory of relativity, Einstein paused to acclaim another. "The first man to suggest this explosive force was a Russian scientist, Dr. A. A. Friedmann, nearly ten years ago," Einstein said.

The question of a pardon for Tom Mooney was put to Dr. Einstein when it was recalled to him that Mooney had asked his intercession with Gov. James Rolph, Jr. Mooney was convicted of bombing a preparedness day parade in San Francisco more than 15 years ago.

"This is a question which should be given serious attention by the people of California," Dr. Einstein said. "I have already written to Governor Rolph expressing my sympathy for Clark County, Nevada.
