in an attempt to identify the three who are wanted.

It was also indicated that one clue leads to a New Jersey city, where five men are under suspicion.

A car in which three of the men rode to Easton has been traced back to New York, and was seen in the vicinity of the express office where the Chicago, Detroit, Cleveland and Youngstown bombs were dispatched.

On the theory that the plot may have been hatched in Cleveland, records and information concerning known enemies of fascism in that city, some of whom have uttered open threats against friends of Mussolini, were sent today to New York where the investigation is now centering.

A suspicious package found today in the mails at New Haven was turned over to the police, who immersed it in water. An attempt to detonate it will be made tomorrow.

It was not believed, however, to contain a bomb.

In the west, an explosion that wrecked the store and home of Rosary Dionisio, at Trinidad, Colo., gave the authorities some concern.

The explosion occurred at midnight, and was evidently that of a powerful bomb. The Dionisio family were absent from home, at a New Year's eve party.

Dionisio, a pioneer Italian resident of Trinidad, told the police he knew of no enemies.

COOK COUNTY CRISIS IS ACUTE

CHICAGO, Jan. 1. (UP)—State legislators and executives, county and city officials, attorneys and committeemen, all agreed tonight that Chicago's financial situation has been made even more distressing by the ruling of Judge Edmund Jarecki that the 1928 and 1929 tax levies were fraudulent and void.

Although Judge Jarecki's ruling was for only one piece of property, attorneys agreed it could be applied to all and that any amount of confusion might arise because of the fact that every Cook county property owner now has a court ruling on which to base a claim that he does not have to pay his taxes.

Much of the strength of the ruling was lost because most of the taxes for 1928 and 1929 already have been paid, there still being some \$71,000,000 outstanding.

Gov. Louis Emmerson, in commenting upon the decision, said it should goad the state legislature into immediate action when the body convenes Tuesday in a special session which was interrupted for the Christmas holidays.

DAMON-PYTHIAS OF TROJAN CREW



The story of the friendship between Gaius "Gus" Shaver and Orville Mohler, twin threats of the University of Southern California football team, is one of the most interesting in gridiron annals. It came to light in the game against Georgia.

LOS ANGELES, Jan. 1. (UP)—An incident in the Southern California-Georgia football game, brought pointedly to the attention of fans in this district the close friendship that has existed between Gaius Shaver and Orville Mohler, the two great Trojan quarterbacks.

All year long they fought for high scoring honors of the Pacific coast, alternating as leader, until finally near the end of the Georgia game, the last regularly scheduled contest, Shaver had a mere four-point advantage.

Both men happened to be in the game since Mohler had gone to quarterback and Shaver had been shifted to fullback to replace Jim Musick.

Southern California had worked the ball to the Georgia two-yard line and since the Trojans were having little trouble scoring it was certain that if Shaver carried the ball he would be the coast's high scorer for the year while Mohler, himself, could claim that honor by a two-point margin, if he called.

COPS SAY BLAST WAS INSIDE JOB
TRINIDAD, Colo., Jan. 1. (UP)—The terrific explosion which demolished the home and store of Rosario Dionisio was probably an "inside job," Fire Chief Frank Cesalini said today after making an investigation.

There were two explosions in the house, Cesalini said. One occurred in the front of the building, where Dionisio has his store, and the other was in the rear, where he and his family live.

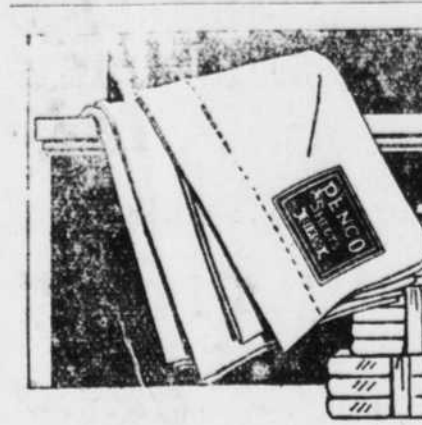

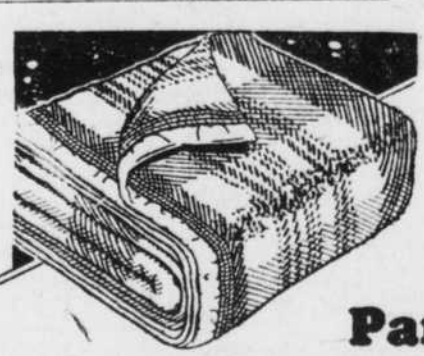
